NO EXTENSION OF THE C. B. INQUIRY

OTTAWA, Oct. 13.—The Royal Commission appointed by the Federal Government to investigate the Sydney Steel Strike will, it is understood, confine its activities to the dispute between the British Empire Steel Corporation and its steel workers. Through some misunderstanding it had been stated that the scope of the inquiry would be widened to include the coal mining industry in Cape Breton. It is pointed out, however, that the coal miners are working under contract which does not expire until next January and that when they went out on strike at the time of the steel dispute they did so "out of sympathy," not because they had any dispute with the employers as to wages.

Moreover, J. B. McLachlan, who was responsible for the coal miners' strike was "outlawed" by John L. Lewis, head of the international organization in the United States.

The whole question has been under consideration by the Dominion Cabinet at one or two recent meetings, and it had been decided that there is no question of extending the area of the Commission's investigation. An organization
