CHURCH CLOCKS TO STOP. OPPOSITION TO C. P. R. LONDON, March 4—It is reported that the Hamburg-American Company has practically obtained the sanction of the Austrian Government for a Steamer Line from Trieste to Boston and the North German Lloyd wants a line from Trieste to Buenos Ayres. These activities are taken as omens of the Atlantic pool against the C. P. R.

CUTTING THIRD TEETH. MIDDLEBORO, March 1—Charles W. Kingham, former chief of the Fire Department and Overseer of the Poor, though sixty-one is cutting a third set of teeth. The discovery of the molars was made by a local dentist, when Mr. Kingham called, complaining that his gums hurt a bit.

PRINCE EDWARD ISLANDER FOR WILSON'S CABINET. WASHINGTON, March 4—A Prince Edward Islander will be a member of President Wilson's cabinet. He is Franklin Knight Lane, born on the Island 1864, educated in California and practiced there. He will be Secretary of the Interior. He has been a member of the Interstate Commerce Commission, and represents the United States on the I. C. R. commission.

HEAVY LOSS BY FIRE. WHITE PLAINS, N. Y., March 4—Eleven buildings in the business district were destroyed by fire early today with a loss of seven hundred thousand dollars.

AN AMALGAMATION. TORONTO, March 4—It is reported that the Standard Loan Company and the Reliance Loan and Savings Company both of Toronto have been amalgamated into the Standard Reliance Mortgage Corporation with five million Capital.

A LONG SESSION. OTTAWA, March 4—Parliament is still in session after continuous sitting for nineteen hours. Laurier after moving the amendment to have the thirty-five million dollars spent on the Canadian Navy, retired at four o'clock. Hon. Frank Oliver then led the Liberals and the debate proceeded with Lemieux, Emmerson and MacKenzie as the speakers. Hazen led the Government forces. The House presents a weird scene, members stretched over the seats and sleeping with heads on their desks. The outlook is a continuous sitting till Saturday night.
