JAS. CLANCY.
 Conservative Candidate in Lambton.
 James Clancy was born in the Township of Moss, County of Middlesex, Ont., July 21, 1844. He has been a member of the Town Council of Dresden, and has also been Reeve of Chatham on several occasions. He sat in the Legislative Assembly of Ontario from 1883 until 1891, in which year he was an unsuccessful candidate. He was first elected to the House of Commons at the general election held in 1896, when he defeated the Hon. D. Mills, Liberal, by a vote of 2,867 to 2,836, Conservative.
