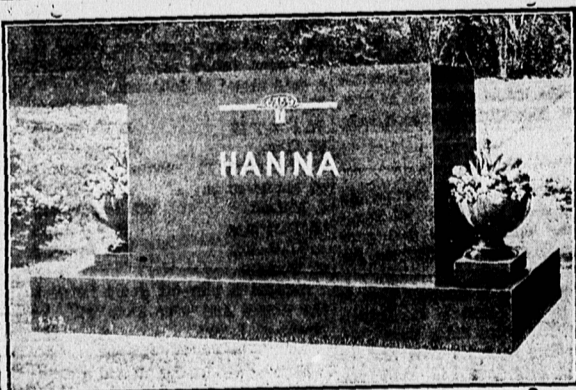

GRANITE BLOCK ACCORDED HONOR

BISBEE, Ariz., April 23. (U. P.)—A block of granite used years ago in deciding single-jack and double-jack drilling contests is to be accorded a place of honor in the new courthouse square, created last year when the county seat was transferred here from Tombstone. The obelisk Board of Supervisors complied with a request of the Pioneers Association to use the stone block as a monument which will bear a copper plate descriptive of its history.

U. S. HOLDS GOLD RATING

NEW YORK, April 23. (U. P.)—Up to the close of last year, the total value of gold mined in America, totaled \$4,500,000, more than half of which has been recovered since the beginning of the century. Of the billion ounces of gold unearthed, 46 percent has been used for general monetary stocks. Since 1905 the United States has been the world's largest gold producer.

Someone Was Running Racket

(Canadian Press) MONTREAL, Que., April 23—Someone was running a "racket" in citizenship papers, O. G. Ogden, K. C., Counsel for the Dominion Government, declared today before the commission delving into illegal naturalization. Forged letters of recommendation, whether written in English or French, bore a remarkable resemblance he said, as though dictated from one brain rather than conceived by different "agents." The commission presided over by Judge James G. Wallace of Woodstock, Ont., today heard of aliens having secured Canadian naturalization through letters supposedly signed by men who had died years ago; by childless men who were represented as being the aliens' fathers, and by employers who had never heard of their supposed employees.

WHEAT ACREAGE UP

WINNIPEG, April 22.—Reports from all sections of Western Canada reaching the Agricultural Department of the Canadian Pacific Railway here indicate that there will be probably a reduction in the wheat acreage on the prairie as follows: Manitoba, 3 per cent below last year's acreage; Saskatchewan, 5 per cent; and Alberta, 5 to 7 per cent.

NEW NATIONAL HIGHWAY WILL EXCELL IN BEAUTY

WASHINGTON, April 23. (U. P.)—A 150 mile highway extending the entire length of Shenandoah National Park has been planned by the Bureau of Public Roads, Interior Department, and it is believed that this will be one of the most beautiful of the great scenic highways. Extending as it will, through the Blue Ridge Mountains, the new proposed highway is expected to surpass all others in the country in popularity. In addition, it will come as a measure of relief to the mountain folk in the historic Blue Ridge Mountains, who are in dire straits. Too proud to accept charity, it is believed that the employment the new highway will offer will be a means of bringing material aid to the impoverished mountaineers. The authority for the construction of the new highway has already been given the National Park Service.
