THE CONFERENCE
REV. DR. CARMAN

His Stirring Address on Methodism With Statistics of the Growth of The Body During The Past Four Years Making a Splendid Record.

MONTREAL, Sept. 12.—The seventh General Conference of the Methodist Church met in Montreal today, and the sessions are expected to extend over two weeks. This is the supreme governing body, the legislative assembly, of the Methodist church in Canada. The annual conference embraced in the jurisdiction of this General Conference are as follows: Toronto, London, Hamilton, Bay of Quinte, Monreal, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island, Newfoundland, Manitoba, Assiniboia, Alberta, British Columbia, Japan and the West China Mission—fourteen in all.

Rev. Dr. Carman, as General Superintendent, expressed his gratification and thanks to the Almighty at their assembling in the quadrennial session of the general conference, in St. James's Methodist church. He urged that nothing be done to weaken the bonds of the healthful connexion of Methodism. "It is more to us than the British Empire to the Briton. The bonds are moral, social, religious, national, and cosmopolitan." He briefly reviewed the whole sys-

tem of the Methodist church from its primary meetings to its quarterly boards, its annual conference, the general conference, all of which have their work to do, and must do it. A flaw here is a failure somewhere else. With the expansion and multiplication of missions, and the increase and aggressiveness of home and foreign agencies, it would seem that the point is well taken, even if we had thought else to do but, promote missionary advance, that there is urgent need of careful deliberation and painstaking direction on the part of the General Conference. Well regulated departmentalization and clear outline of relations and powers must even then leave grave problems enough to tax the most cautious, prudent and vigorous administration. Such considerations must impress upon us with peculiar force that we are now assembled in the name of the Lord of the harvest and judge of the whole earth under weightiest obligations for closest attention to the most important business that can claim the consecrated and loyal effort of Christian men.

practical work. Dr Carman made a rapid survey of the conditions in all lands, intimating his belief that many of the troubles which were apparent in all civilized countries were due to the fact that the church is off her base and "brings into collision the aggression of centuries and highest interests of a free people." This led him to an exordium on Methodism, which he praised as of spiritual birth and lineage in its founder and his associates, sons of God, born not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God; not of learning or science or art or philosophy or theology; though it has all of these, and more of them than it has consecrated to Christ; not of wealth or social position or lordly estate, or royal favor; not of worldly or political resource or advantage; though it has more of these than is sanctified by the Holy Ghost; not of some ecclesiastical order or vaunted historic succession; but of a divine interposition and demonstration in the realm of spiritual life, where man feels and owns the uplifting and transforming power of God. On the human side it has had its Bethlehems and Bethanys and Gethsemanes. It came forth from the stern discipline and exorcising poverty of the Epworth Rectory and held on its way of struggle and suffering with its message of pardon for the guilty, of holiness for the pardoned, of assurance for the adopted; of glory for the believer, of light in the darkness and life from the dead. This is its charge, its treasure, its special trust, which it must hold sacred and safe in spite of temptation and opposition, persecution, or peril and distress. Neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come should move us from our foundations as we build up the temple of God.
