 How noisy then their vocal supplement.

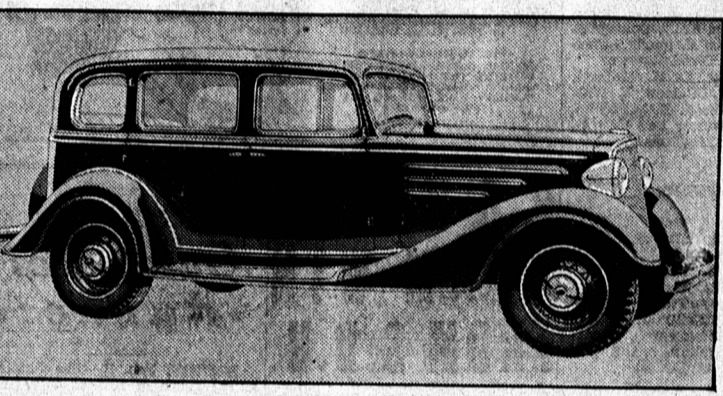

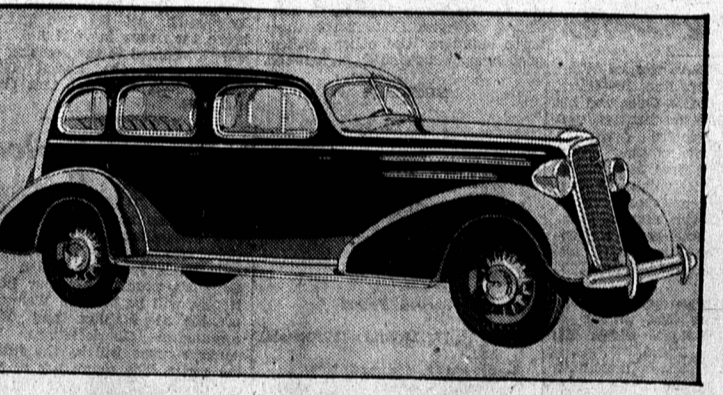
