NEW MINERAL IN CAPE BRETON.

NORTH SYDNEY, Feb. 28.—What promises to be a valuable discovery was recently made near Whycocomagh. The mineral referred to is hermitite, and is very rare. This mineral is sometimes called "nature iron," and is of great value, and is found chiefly in Lake Superior and Cuba. The eyes of capitalists are now turning towards Cape Breton, whose future is exceedingly bright for mining enterprises.

'Cape Britons Wild Animals.

SYDNEY Feb 28.—Wild Cats are becoming alarmingly numerous throughout Cape Breton, and in many places are causing considerable trouble to the farms, carrying off their fowls etc. Fur bearing animals are exceptionally plentiful this year, and large numbers of musk rats, foxes, mink, otter, and lynx skins, are daily shipped from Cape Breton to Halifax, where the market is exceptionally good.
