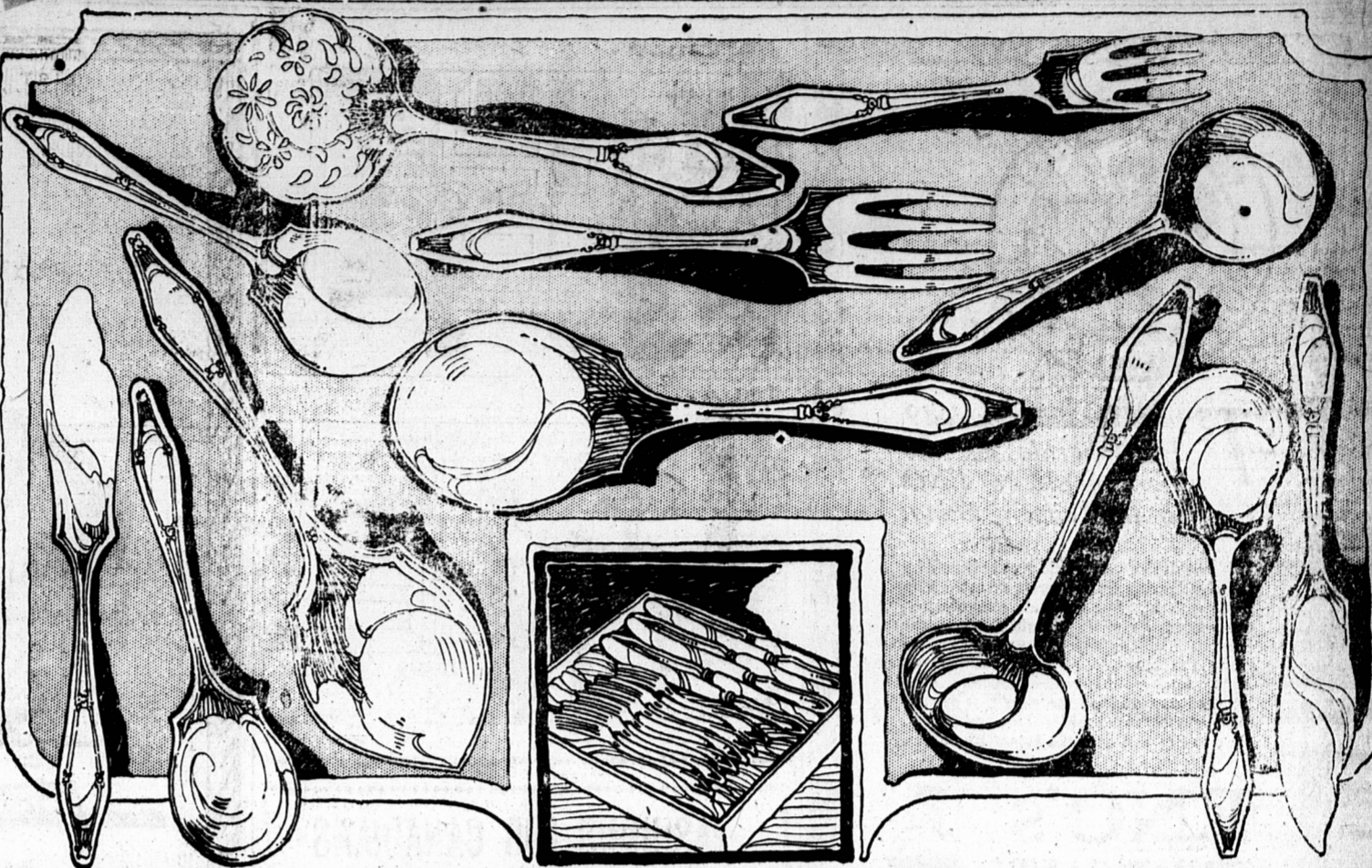

NOTES ON THE CHARLOTTE-TOWN EGG LAYING CONTEST

The Prince Edward Island Egg Laying Contest made good progress last week; four additional pens started laying, and several of the pens previously reported as doing well made good gains. One bird laid 7 eggs, 2 laid 6 eggs and 14 laid 5 eggs, during the 5th week of the contest, ending December 5th. The leading pen, White Leghorns, owned by Edwin Reid of Rollo Bay, laid 20 eggs, with 2 birds moulting; total eggs to date, 72. Second place is held by a pen of Barred Rocks owned by the Experimental Station, that laid 21 eggs during the week, and has a total of 33. The following pens started laying during the week:

White Leghorns, owned by James J. Jenkins of Orwell Cove, with 7 eggs. White Leghorns, owned by Cornelius McLellan of Arlington, with 1 egg.

Barred Rocks, owned by H. S. Moase of Kensington, with 5 eggs. Barred Rocks, owned by Wallace McKay of Stanley Bridge, with 1 egg.

The total number of eggs for the week was 133, total to date, 276. The pens that have not started laying are:

A pen of White Leghorns owned by Mrs. R. W. Bulpitt of Cardigan, which has one pullet now mature, and others now fairly well developed. They were late pullets. The pen of Barred Rocks of Mr. W. G. Darke, of Brookfield, are not uniform in development, and are coming on rather slowly.

The pen of Barred Rocks of Mr. Walter Buntain of South Rustico had a set back from a rather bad cold. They were given salts, and treated with Permanganate of Potash and are now well again.

A pen of Barred Rocks of Mr. John E. Sinclair, of Summerfield, also had a bad cold; they were treated, and 8 of them are now well. The other two are better.

A pen of Barred Rocks of Mr. James Cain of New Perth have made good progress, and are now about mature.

THE PEN OF WHITE WYANDOTTES

of Mr. J. D. McLellan, of Richmond, are rather slow developing. The White Leghorns of Mr. F. W. E. Haslam, of Bradalbane, have grown large for the breed. They are now developing well. The White Wyandottes of Rev. M. Monaghan, of Miscouche, are now about mature. This pen did not take to the dry mash when they came in first, and were slow in
