**\*SCHOONER LEAVES.**—The fishing schooner *Viola G. Hartsh*, Juddore, N. S., left Souris Friday morning for the north side of the Island, where she will spend the summer cod-fishing.

**\*VERY LARGE CATCH.**—The Murray R. Munroe made a great catch of mackerel off East Point Thursday night. She landed 1,900 in the following morning. This is the second large catch that this schooner has made this week. On last Monday morning she landed 2,300.

**\*DREDGING BEGAN** in Souris harbor Friday. This work is being done by the Halifax Dredging Co. The crew consists of five men and is under the superintendence of Mr. Sylvester Beasley, Halifax. Mr. Beasley says that about 18 inches must be taken off the bottom in order to level it for cribs, which will be put down in extending the breakwater.

**\*OLD WRECK.**—The bottom of an old vessel was discovered at the end of the Souris breakwater Friday. It is almost buried by sand and stone and only sixteen inches of it rose above the level bottom. The work on the breakwater is retarded as this prevents the cribs from being placed properly. The foreman, undecided in the matter, telephoned for the Government engineer.

**\*SCHOONERS ARRIVE.**—The following fishing schooners were in Souris Harbor Friday evening:—Annie M., Souris; Florence May, Canso; Stanley Hubley, Canso; Irene, Canso; Adnan, Halifax; Handy Andy, Halifax; Hilda M. Horton, Halifax; Florence M., Queenstown; Defender, Brae St. May; Tietie, Catalogue and R. Saint. The last five are from Newfoundland and are new arrivals.

**\*LONG JOURNEY.**—Messrs. Jim and Rod Shenell, Souris, set sail Friday morning for the Coast of Labrador. They will first visit the Magdalen Islands and will continue their voyage from there. Their vessel "The Tyne" is a fore-and-aft and is as commodious as it is worthy. It is their intention to be absent on this voyage, which is a prospective one, for at least two years. Besides two dories and a canoe they have on board a large supply of provisions, nets, traps, etc. Their many friends in Souris wish them every success and will have a kindly interest in them until they arrive home safely from their long and tedious cruise.

**ALWAYS CONSULT THE PHONE DIRECTORY**

Almost every day The Guardian remarks of an advertising nature. In most of these cases the senders, who are frequently not known to any number of the staff and who have no account in the advertising department, write the advertiser, implying that they think the items will be inserted free. Only a few weeks ago a reader wrote asking that his advertisement of Farm for Sale be inserted free from day to day until he cancelled it, as he is a subscriber to The Guardian. It is apparent that the price is not sufficient to even pay the actual cost of paper, ink, presswork, mailing, bookkeeping and other expenses of the Circulation department. When for church or charitable purposes they seldom ever say so, or do not enclose sufficient money to pay for same, all of which will be returned by first mail in the event of the item not being chargeable, or if more money is sent than necessary to pay for the item the surplus will be returned at once, there being a greater discount for cash with orders than for regular business. In all such cases the advertiser is charged for the copy as possible by mail or phone, or by paying the messenger service to get them to the telephone if not too far distant, thus saving all possible time. People write this office to know if News Letters to Editor, etc., are charged for, and to all such there is but one reply—All items of this money making nature, even though they be somewhat of a news nature, are chargeable. For instance, the advertisement of a concert, lecture, picnic, etc., are chargeable if there is an admission fee, silver collection, sale of pies or sale of food or refreshments, etc. Advance notices of purely religious services, even though a silver collection is to be taken up, are not chargeable. The particulars of any of the above, after they have been held, are, however, news and thus not chargeable. The news of any past present or future business, which is still being conducted, is chargeable, if it is apparent that the object is to make the business more widely known and thus increase it. Various accompanying death notices are also chargeable. Even items which are actual news and not chargeable but once in either Morning Daily or Evening Daily or both are chargeable for more than one insertion, as they are thus not news. The above facts are given for the purpose of assisting persons who have items, etc., to mail to this office, so that delay and disappointment will be avoided.
