Mining Strike Cuts Exports of Britain

LONDON, Sept. 13.—Some idea of the cost of the British coal strike is revealed by Board of Trade figures just issued for the month of August.

British exports in August totalled 49,786,744 sterling which was 7,477,062 below the July exports and 11,251,255 below those of August, 1925.

Imports showed an increase over August last year of nearly £10,000,000. Coal imports are valued at £7,542,874 as against a nominal import of only a thousand pounds, while only a meagre £3,400 worth of coal was exported a drop of 3,156,530 pounds.

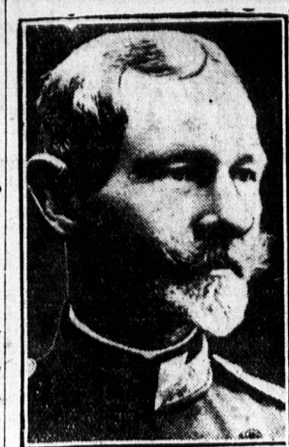

Livestock Market

MONTREAL, Sept. 13.—Cattle receipts 1196. The cattle market was steady with sales somewhat drab but prices firm to a shade better in spots. One load of choice black steers were sold on Saturday for export at 7.90. Good Butcher steers sold locally from 6.50 to 6.75 with a top of 5.00. Medium steers brought from 5.75 to 6.25. Good cows were a shade stronger, selling from 5.00 to 5.25. Medium heifers brought 5.25 to 5.75 and Bologna bulls 2.75. The bulk of the common cows were sold together from 4.50 light steers, heifers and medium to 5.25. Quotations butcher steers: choice 7.90, good 6.50 to 7.00, medium 4.75 to 6.25, common 4.50 to 5.50. Butcher heifers good 6.00 to 6.50, medium 5.25 to 5.75, common 4.00 to 5.00. Butcher cows good 5.00 to 5.25, medium 3.25 to 4.50, canners 1.75 to 2.00, cutters 2.00 to 2.75. Butcher bulls common 3.00 to 3.75. Calf receipts 3442. Veal calves were scarce and the best sold from 11.00 to 11.50. Fairly good suckers brought from 10.00 to 11.00 and heavy pair red calves ranged from 6.00 to 8.75. There was a heavy offering of grassers and prices were lower. Sales ranged from 4.15 to 4.50. Quotations good veal 10.00 to 11.00, medium 8.00 to 8.75. Common 6.00 to 8.00, grass 4.15 to 4.75. Sheep receipts 5993. Lamb prices were about 75 cents lower than last week. The best quality ewes and wethers sold for 12.50 and the bucks from the same lots 11.50. Poorer quality lots brought 11.00 to 12.00 for the ewes and wethers and 1.00 per cent less for the bucks. Sheep sold from 6.00 to 6.75. Quotations, ewes 4.00 to 6.75. Lambs good 11.50 to 12.50, common 10.00 to 11.25. Hog receipts 374. Good quality hogs sold at 13.50. Sows sold around 11.00 to with a few trim light ones at 11.50.

LONDON, Sept. 13.—While women are wearing the flimsiest of muslin and voile frocks, the fur experts are deciding what are to be the fur fashions for the coming winter.

Already advance model coats are being shown to the chosen few. Golden seal, shaved leopard, shaved hare, dyed and patterned in lizard designs and rabbit in all colors are some of the novelties. Chinchilla and Silver Black fox favorites with Queen Mary, and two of the most expensive furs, are to be favorites with blonde women. A chinchilla coat with a bolster collar so high that it hid the head of the wearer, displayed at a recent dress parade, was priced at \$6,000. These coats may cost up to \$10,000 or \$15,000.

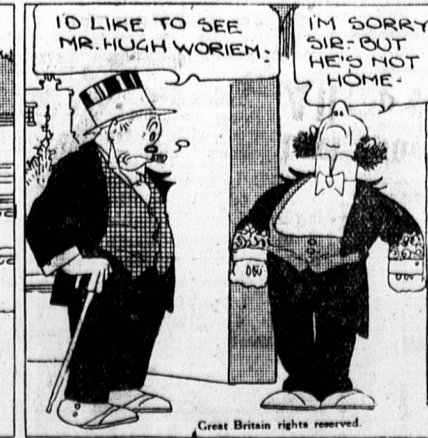

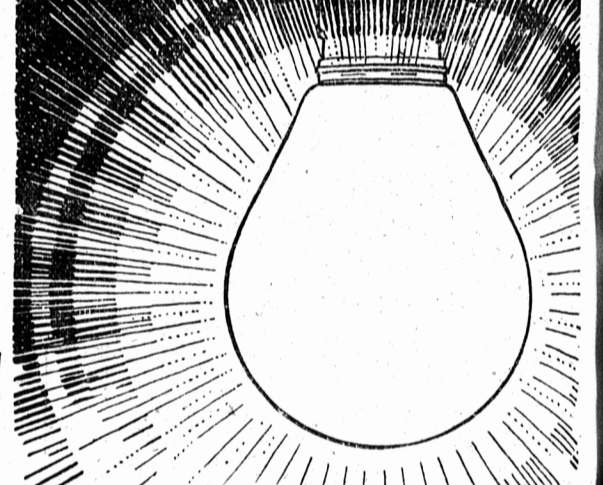
