Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

THE sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years old, may homestead a quarter section of a Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Land Agency but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years cultivates 50 acres and erect a house worth \$300.

The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

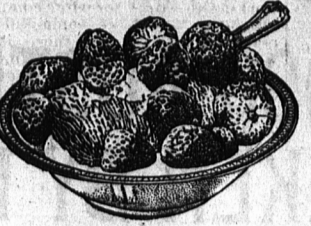

LONDON, June 8.—A Central News despatch from Amsterdam says that a German official statement declares that the loss of cruisers Lutzow and Roslock, in the battle off Jutland, was withheld for military reasons. Both ships are said to have sunk while on their way to a harbor for repairs.

This is the first mentioned of the loss of the cruiser Roslock.

The Lutzow was a small warship of 4,900 tons, and was built in 1912. She carried 373 men, and was armed with twelve four inch guns, and two torpedo tubes.

The Lutzow was 26,000 ton dreadnought battle cruiser. Her destruction has previously been claimed by British naval officers.

CRUISER HAMPSHIRE STRUCK MINE

LONDON, June 11.—The British cruiser Hampshire, on which Kitchen and his staff were lost, sank as the result of striking a mine. This is announced officially. All hope is abandoned for all save the twelve from the Hampshire who were washed ashore. The statement says "Admiral Jellicoe states the Hampshire was mined. The vessel was accompanied by two destroyers until the Hampshire was compelled to detach them on account of heavy seas an hour before the explosion. Survivors say the Hampshire sank in ten minutes. The destroyers and patrol vessels hurried to the scene. Search parties sent motor cars along the coast. Four boats were seen to leave the ship. Admiral Jellicoe concludes that all were wrecked on the lee shore. Twelve survivors landed from a raft.

MAY RISE LUSITANIA WITH NOVEL SUBMARINE.

BRIDGEPORT, Conn., June 10.—More treasure than Captain Kidd ever dreamed of possessing is to be taken from the waters of the Atlantic if the promises of a corporation organized to explore the floor of the ocean materialized. The Argonauts Salvage Corporation of Milford, a \$3,000,000 concern has contracted with foreign governments under which it will build submarines to hunt and raise sunken steamers.

An especially constructed submersible will be used by the company for the purpose of sending a diver to the bottom of the ocean and with the aid of a diver's compartment the wrecks will be explored, repaired and raised. It is expected that an attempt will be made a rise the Lusitania, valued at more than \$3,000,000.

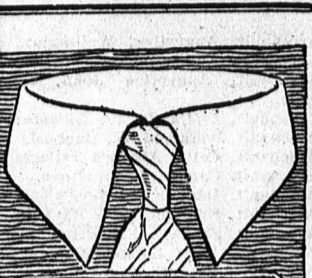
