CONSTABULARY WANT REDRESS

BELFAST, Aug. 3.—The parade of the disaffected members of the local police force, which was scheduled to take place today, has been postponed if not altogether abandoned, apparently to enable the government to be in a position to dismiss the entire police force of the city should drastic action become necessary.
 The men remain defiant and declare they will not cease agitation until they have secured a public enquiry into their alleged grievances. Constable Barrett, who was dismissed from the force for agitation, declares that among the grievances of the men is the fact that under the present "Dublin Castle" system only those men who are willing to play the part of provocative agents can gain promotion. Barrett claims that the present agitation will put an end to the "abominable system of manufacturing crime."

Hurled To Death On French Ship

Three Persons Killed and Wounded by a Terrific Explosion on the Couronne—All the Bodies Terribly Mutilated Cause a Mystery.

TOULON, Aug. 3.—The breach of a hundred millimeter gun was blown off today on board the gunnery school ship Couronne during target practice in Salins Roadstead and three persons were killed and five wounded. The force of the explosion was terrific. The bodies of the dead men were so badly mutilated as to be almost unrecognizable. Three of those wounded are in a serious condition.
 As soon as he learned of the accident, Admiral Marquis sent the armoured cruiser Letouche-Tréville to the assistance of the Couronne.
 The dead and the wounded were taken aboard the cruiser, which conveyed them to the Naval Hospital of St. Mandrier where everything had been prepared for their reception. The accident caused a sensation in the town, where most of the members of the crew of the Couronne belong and flags are at half mast as a sign of mourning.
 The cause of the explosion is a mystery.

LONDON, Aug. 3.—After trying to deal with the recurring problem of the unemployed army for several winters without much success, the British parliament is to consider a new and drastic plan. Ramsay MacDonald, one of the most prominent labor members, has introduced a bill which makes the way of the undesirable and the unemployed very hard.
 The genuine workman out of a job will be assured employment. The local authorities will be compelled to find him work at trade union wages; but he will get no further consideration.
 The inveterate idler is dealt with very severely. If the local authority reports that any man's unemployment is due to "deliberate and habitual disinclination to work," that man may be brought before a court and ordered to six months' labor under control.
