The Guardian's magnificent trophy for the sixteen mile bicycle road race on Wednesday, August twenty-eight, is on exhibition in Prowse Block, show window today.

Extensive repairs are being made to the West River Bridge. A substantial rail is being placed on both sides of the bridge something that was needed and the structure is being built up and strengthened in a very creditable manner.

At St. Dunstan's yesterday it was announced that the formal dedication of the new Cathedral would take place on the 12th of next month, as already announced in The Guardian. The sermon on the occasion is to be preached by Rev. Father Gordon, and there will very likely be a large attendance of clergy both from this diocese and from the other provinces.

Rapid and commendable progress is being made in laying down the concrete sidewalks in this City. The walk is now being laid on both sides of Kent Street from Queen Street to the Park and this when finished will give a complete course for nearly the full length of Kent Street on both sides. The new walk is being placed further out than the old one and is improving the appearance of the street.

As an outcome of the horse racing which took place at New Glasgow, N. S., on Wednesday last a match race was arranged between Bushall, a horse owned by Victor Douse of Charlottetown, and William another pacer owned by Nat Dougherty, of Stellarton, N. S., for a purse of \$100. The race came off on Saturday and was won by Bushall. It was half mile heats, and the first and second were won by William in 1:10 and 1:11; the three next heats went to Bushall in 1:07, 1:07, and 1:09. There was quite a lot of interest taken in the contest.

The marriage of Rev. J. E. Wilkinson of the Alberta Methodist Conference, took place at Cassopolis, Prince Edward County, Ontario on July 19th, to Miss May Anderson of that place. Mr. Wilkinson has lately graduated from Wesley College, Winnipeg, where he received the Victorian scholarship, the Governor General's bronze medal, and was one of the two students who was successful in winning the Thos. Nixon prize in elocution. Mr. Wilkinson and his bride are now visiting his parents John and Mrs. Wilkinson, at Bridgetown, Nova Scotia, who were formerly of Alberton. After a few weeks spent among friends in Nova Scotia and Ontario, they will return to Valley City, Lacombe, Alberta, where Mr. Wilkinson has been appointed pastor of a church.

The Maple Leaf, of Oakland, Cal., in speaking of the recent laying of the corner stone, at Berkeley, Cal., of St. Joseph's Church says: "The new church will be of splendid proportions with perfect arrangements for all functions and ceremonies. It will be 137 1/2 feet long by 35 wide, with a seating capacity of about 1,000 worshippers. The architecture is Romanesque with concrete foundation and frame superstructure, two tower spires setting off the front. The pastor, Dr. F. X. Morrison, is a native of Prince Edward Island (a brother of Rev. Dr. Morrison of this City) and well known to the Oakland Society of the Sons and Daughters of the Maritime Provinces. Two years ago he went from Oakland to take charge of this parish, one of the largest and most important. In the archdiocese embracing not only a great church but a large convent and St. Joseph's Academy, where upwards of 200 pupils are instructed in all branches of learning. Dr. Morrison, with his strong personality and scholarly attainments, will carry through successfully the duties assigned him.
