

# WORKING WOMEN

New York, September 28.—A special cable dispatch from London to the Times states that the heirs of one of the victims of the Grantham disaster have received \$10,000 insurance which was effected at the cost of one penny.

The insured was a regular subscriber to a London Penny Weekly which insures its readers against accident and death. The day of the disaster he sent his bag, containing a current copy of the paper duly signed, to the hotel at Retford, where he expected to pass the night. Within a few hours of his death the claim was examined, allowed, and settled.

## REFUSED PALMA'S RESIGNATION

HAVANA, Sept. 27.—The Assembly of Moderates tonight decided to refuse to accept President Palma's resignation in the hope of inducing him to continue in office and thus avoid intervention. Intervention by the installation of a provisional Government was contemplated for tomorrow, but the U. S. Peace Commissioners will await the developments in Congress.

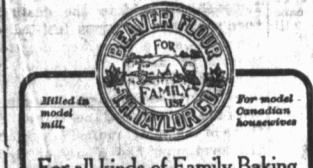
