CAPTAIN TRANSFERRED.—Captain John H. S. S. ROSALINA REPAIRED.—After being laid up since she went ashore near New York in September, the Red Cross liner Rosalina, which formerly ran to Charlottetown has resumed the New York Halifax and St. John's, Nfld., service. In addition to repairing the damage caused by her running ashore, some improvements have been made in the passenger accommodations on board. The Rosalina has been converted into an oil burning vessel, and a shelter deck has been built.

MISS WYATT TO STUDY LAW.—An exceptional feature of the Supreme Court sittings in Summerside was the application by Attorney General Johnston for the admission of Miss Wanda Wyatt, B. A., daughter of Mr. J. E. Wyatt, K. C., of Summerside as a law student in the Province of Prince Edward Island. This is the first case in Prince Edward Island of the admission of a lady to the study of law. Miss Wyatt is a graduate of McGill University where she qualified for a legal career, and it is superfluous to add that her many friends, the members of the bar, the press, and the public wish her every success in the high and honorable profession to which she will be called in due course. His Lordship, Chief Justice Matheson, in granting the application said it gave him the greatest pleasure to welcome Miss Wyatt as a student of law.—Pioneer.
