LONDON, July 10—(UP)—The London Daily Mail, an independent Conservative newspaper, said this morning that a general election in November in England was regarded as certain as a result of three pending challenges to the government.

Each of these challenges, the Daily Mail said, held the threat of defeat of Premier J. Ramsay MacDonald's Labor administration, in office little more than a year.

The danger lies in these three things, it said:

1—A combined Conservative and Liberal attack in the finance bill scheduled to come up tomorrow.

2—A Conservative vote of censure on the Government's protection policy.

3—A combined Conservative and Liberal attack on the Government's policy in India.

The last two challenges, the paper said, were scheduled to be debated in the near future.
