WORLD WAR EXPERIENCE TEACHES ALCOHOL IS A TRAITOR

Brigadier General F. P. Crozier, C.B., C.D., D.S.O., author of "A Brass Hat in No Man's Land" and "Impressions and Recollections," has this to say in the latter book: "The history of alcohol, used as a beverage during the Great War, and my knowledge of it from close personal contact and experience, leads me to the conclusion that if ever this country again becomes embroiled in a fight for its existence—which God forbid—the manufacture, sale and consumption of all spirits should be controlled by law. Many Colonels, Majors, Captains and Subalterns, in my own knowledge, rendered themselves useless during the Great War, and many of them were killed in France owing to their taking too much strong drink."
