4th.—Live Stock, by W. M. Moffatt.

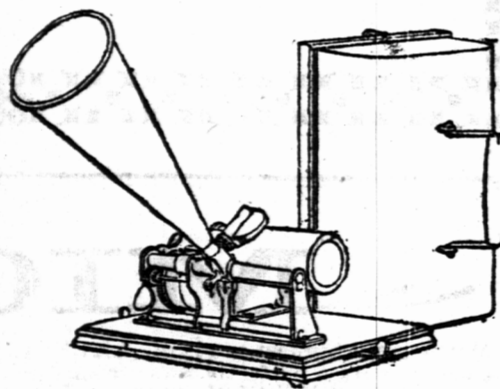
5th.—Advantages of mixed farming, by Wm. Laird.

The retiring president R. E. Bagnall made an appropriate reference to the death of our late beloved Queen and was followed by Wm. Laird who moved that, out of respect to her memory, the meeting adjourn without discussion. The next meeting will be held on Monday, Feb. 4th at 7 p. m. and the public are cordially invited to attend.

MEMORIAL SERVICE AT CORNWALL.—

On Sunday morning the 27th inst. a memorial service for our late Sovereign Lady, Queen Victoria was held in the Methodist Church at Cornwall. The church was fittingly draped. On either side of the pulpit stood the pictures of Her Majesty and her son and successor King Edward VII, both heavily draped. A very forcible and eloquent sermon, suitable to the occasion, was preached, by the Rev. W. B. Thomas, who based his remarks on Second Chronicles 32:32. Reference was made to the social and religious influence of the Queen affecting as it did for good her people, throughout Her own Empire, and the whole world. He showed that Great Britain owed its present greatness and glory more to the personal influence of Queen Victoria than to any acts of her statesmen. He further discussed her virtues under the heads of Wife, Mother, Queen, and Christian. As wife she was all that could be desired and it might truly be said, "The heart of her husband doth safely trust in her." As mother, she carefully trained her children for lives of usefulness, and while she could command the society of the world's best, she preferred rather that of her husband and children, and as a consequence "Her children arise up and call her blessed." He also explained that she was a Mother in a wider sense to her subjects, entering largely into their sympathies. As Queen, she possessed both legislative and executive ability and her advice was often sought and followed by Her Council. In conclusion he claimed that she was a strictly Christian Queen, and quoted her reply when informed that she had succeeded the crown, which was, "I'll be good." And she was good and has left an example in that way, which shall never be forgotten. He also quoted her reply, when approached as to her attitude on personal religion, which was, "The Queen relies wholly in the merits of her Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ and possesses peace, through believing in Him."

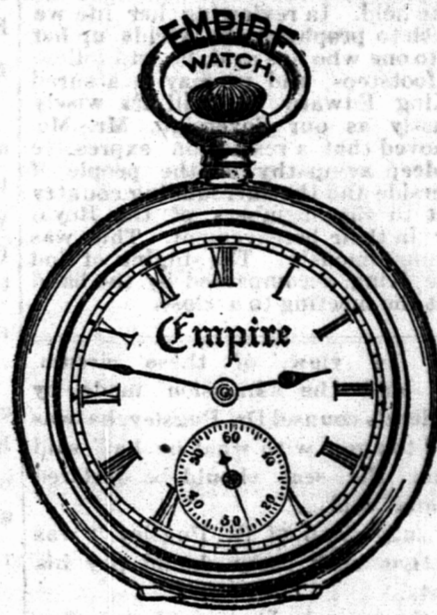
