

THE BUTTER, CHEESE AND EGG MARKET.

HALIFAX, November 21.—The local supply of dairy butter has been very light of late, but the trade are expecting an improvement almost immediately, as cows that have been dry for the past couple of months have again begun milking. The farmers are now going in more than they used to for winter dairying. Last winter the output was larger than ever before, and this year it is expected it will be larger still. The Ontario butter market is very fine with good prospects for makers. British Columbia is looking to the east for supplies, owing to non arrival of her usual receipts from New Zealand. New York is also looking about to see if she can get supplies from eastern Canada. New Ontario dairy rolls are now being offered, but none have reached this market up to the time of writing.

The last of the cheese factories has closed, and the sales of November make were made in Ontario factory last week at no less than 15c. The outlook is decidedly favorable to higher prices. The stocks in Canada and New England show a great shrinkage as compared with last year at this date, and we should not be at all surprised to see the jobbing price advanced to 18 cents before long.

Receipts of new laid eggs in Halifax this week are practically nil. The hens are moulting. Dealers will pay almost any price for strictly fresh stock, but they can't get it. We heard of a sale of circle eggs in Charlottetown last week at 35 cents. Every body seems to believe in higher prices in the future. The cause is the shortage in the supply of eggs in England. Usually Russia and Scandinavia send a good many to England, but now they are cut off. We quote jobbing prices as follows:

SHOWN WORTHLESS. WASHINGTON, November 21.—After an exhaustive investigation, the United States public health service today announces Dr. F. F. Friedmann, the Berlin physician, has no claims to a discovery of a specific cure for tuberculosis. The investigations showed that "one-fourth of all the cases received the treatment developed run-down noses or abscesses at the place where they were injected." The report added that while some patients were buoyed up after an injection of the serum others "progressed to a speedy death."

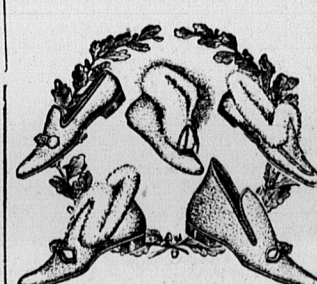
