GERMAN SPIES IN PORT GIVE INFORMATION

Captain of British Freighter Told How Cruiser Dresden Met Him German Gunners Wasted Forty Shots Before They Could Sink Steamer

BARBADOS, W. I., Sept. 27.—The captain of the Raeburn, of the Lamport and Holt Line, reported here a conversation with the commander of the British freighter Hyades, which was sunk by the German cruiser Dresden off the South American coast. The story of the Hyades' captain explains why German cruisers have been able to destroy a number of British vessels in various parts of the world. Apparently the German Government has spies in the principal shipping ports who know what courses vessels are to take and communicate that information to the German cruisers.

When the Hyades left Rio de Janeiro with a cargo of grain her commander was instructed specifically on what course to take. This course would take him straight out into the Atlantic for two days before turning northward.

Therefore, on the second day out, the captain of the Hyades was greatly surprised suddenly to run upon the Dresden, which was lying to and being coaled and provisioned by two auxiliary vessels. Too late to escape, the Hyades had to obey the order to approach the Dresden. A boarding party took the captain aboard the Dresden. The commander asked him what he had on board and where he was bound.

"I have a cargo of grain consigned to the German army and to be delivered via Holland," was the reply. "How are you going to get to Holland?"

"I intend to go up the Channel, (as this is an English vessel.)

"Well, I'll just make certain that that grain does not fall into the hands of the British on the way. You and your crew will have just one hour to get yourselves and your private possessions of the Hyades, for I am going to sink her right where she lies."

After much argument the time was extended to an hour and a half, and in that time the officers and crew of the Hyades went on board one of the German vessels alongside the Dresden. Then the Dresden opened fire on the Hyades, taking forty shots to sink her.

In his conversation on board the Dresden, the captain of the Hyades expressed surprise that he should have run upon the warship as he had steered a secret course, never taken before, purposely to avoid the Dresden, the secret course having been given to him at Rio de Janeiro.

The commander of the Dresden laughed and remarked that the Hyades' secret course had been given to him by wireless and that he had proceeded to that spot to wait for the Hyades. This indicated that a German spy in Rio de Janeiro knew of the secret course and warned the Dresden.

Although the Hyades was only two days out when she was sunk, the German vessel on which they had been placed took such a zigzag course that it was eight days before they reached port again.
