In the stillness of the Sabbath noon September 18th, Mrs. Hannah Carver, beloved wife of Richard Carver, of Pownal, passed peacefully to the never ending rest beyond. The many months preceding her departure were months of great weakness and weariness, but she calmly and patiently bore her burden of affliction and in the spirit of a true and beautiful resignation awaited the coming of life's close.
