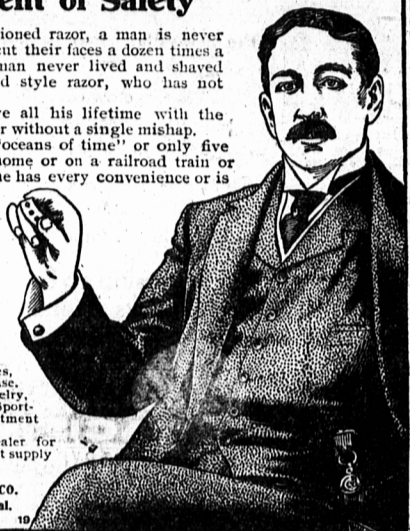

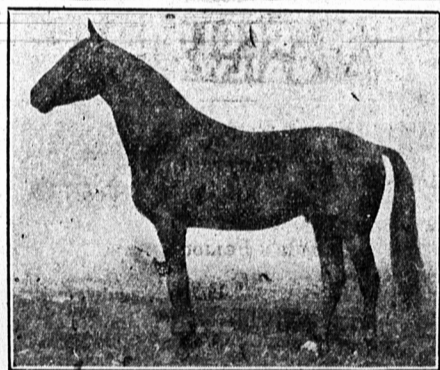

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTHWEST HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

Any even numbered section of Dominion Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of the family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section 160 acres, more or less.

Applications for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Land Agency or Sub-agency for the district in which the land is situated. Entry by proxy may however, be made at an Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of any intending homesteader.

The homesteader is required to perform the homestead duties under one of the following plans.

(1) At least six months residence upon the cultivation of the land in each year for three years.

(2) A homesteader may, if he so desires perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. Joint ownership in land will not meet this requirement.

(3) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of homesteader has permanent residence on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent in the vicinity of the homestead, or upon a homestead entered by him in the vicinity such homesteader may perform his residence duties by living with the father, or mother.

(4) The term "vicinity" in the two preceding paragraphs is defined as meaning not more than nine miles in a direct line, exclusive of the width of road allowances crossed in the measurement.

(5) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents or on farming land owned by himself must notify the Agent or the district of such intention. Six months' notice in writing should be given to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa, of intention to apply for patent.

THE YOUNG MAN IN PUBLIC LIFE.

It was recently pointed out by the London correspondent of a New York newspaper—a remarkable feature of the Asquith Ministry in the comparative youthfulness of many of its members. Thus, Lord Lucas is 32, Winston Churchill 33, Mr. Adard 34, Mr. Masterman 35, Mr. Runciman 38, and Col Seely 40. Mr. Kinnon Wood, the most venerable of the Ministers, is 53 years old, while Sir Edward Grey and Mr. Lloyd-George are, respectively, 46 and 45; Now, to the English public, this is no great novelty. There has been a tradition of youth in the House of Commons for two centuries, and Englishmen are always ready to see a young man forge ahead on his merits. Moreover the English Parliamentary system affords opportunity to ambitious youth desiring to rise rapidly to high office.

The classic example is, of course, William Pitt, whose acceptance of the premiership was received in the House of Commons with "derisive laughter," he being then but twenty four years old. His father had not entered the cabinet till he was forty eight, and did not become Prime Minister until ten years later.

Charles James Fox first took his seat in the cabinet at Winston Churchill's age, and Gladstone was a year older, or thirty-four, as was Robert Peel when he first received a portfolio. Palmerston probably attained this honor younger and became Secretary for War at twenty-five. Lord John Russell became Home Secretary at forty-three, while Lords Salisbury and Rosebery entered the Cabinet at thirty-six and thirty-nine years respectively. Undoubtedly many of these who have become distinguished in early years owed it in part to did Pitt, to family prestige, they fairly earned their honors. High office cannot be retained in England unless its occupant has ability and brains; with these essentials the path to distinction lies open to men of high and low estate.

This is well illustrated in the Asquith Ministry. Besides John Burns, the workman, Mr. Lloyd-George and Dr. Macnamara are both men of humble ancestry. The latter was born at the barracks at Montreal, where his father was a regimental sergeant. Their ages, too, prove that the man from the ranks is not kept too long in tutelage. Mr. Runciman whose family have long been wealthy shipowners in Liverpool, stands in a marked degree for the commercial life of the country. The universities are represented among the new men by Lord Lucas and Mr. Masterman. Indeed, one cannot run over the list without feeling that the British Cabinet is more representative than is our own in the Dominion of Canada.

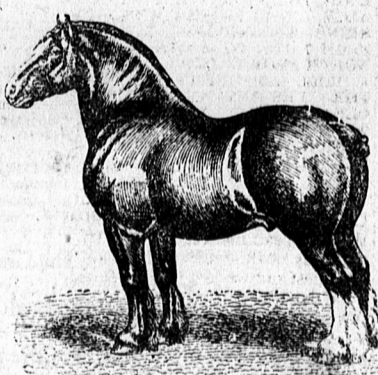

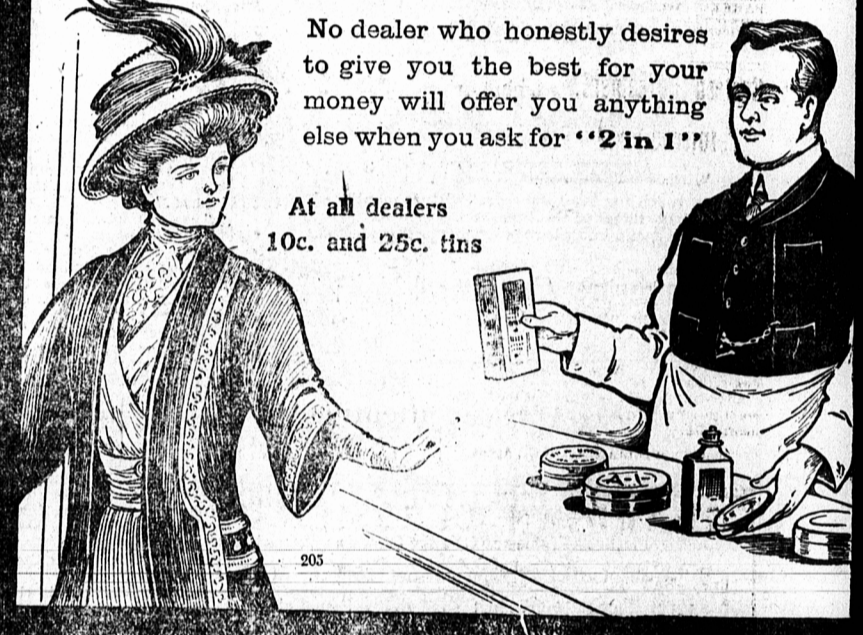
