## LOCAL BRIEFS "MAJAH"

Latest News of the City and Province.

THE Government has placed a contract with the Springhill mines for 135,000 tons of coal.

Mr. C. Bruce McDougall, of the I. C. R. Moncton, the man with the many old newspaper experiences, will bring out a new paper on Sept. 1st.

FREEMAN C. Coffin, C. E., of Messrs. Lee & Coffin, engineers of Boston and Montreal, arrived in town tonight to consult with his partner, Mr. Lee, in regard to our sewerage system, the preliminary work of which is now being rapidly pushed forward by engineers and contractors. —Truro News, July 4.

At the Police Court on Saturday morning, Ronald MacDonald, for being drunk and incapable, was fined \$10 or 60 days. Another drunk, Donald McIsaac, was fined \$2 or 10 days. The summons in an assault case was dismissed. On Friday John Ready and Vernon McAnuly were fined \$2 or ten days for drunkenness. Ernest Prunty was given two months for ill-treating his grand parents.

THE Inverness Coal Co. are not by any means lacking in enterprise. They are spending a large amount of capital on their Port Hood areas, supplying their mine with modern plant. A large boiler, fan and other machinery have been purchased. Some thirty men are steadily employed and many more will be offered work soon. Coal has been mined for some time, and besides supplying the Inverness railway with twenty tons daily, 500 tons are ready for shipment. Several cargoes have been shipped to Charlottetown this summer. A large shipping pier has been constructed which, when completed, will furnish facilities for loading steamers. The prospects are indeed bright for Port Hood and surrounding country, with the new railway and the development of the extensive coal areas. —Sydney Herald.

## TAYLOR

Colored Biker Won Match in Straight Heats.

### DISPLAYS GREAT EASE

He is termed the Colored Demonstrator by N. Y. Papers.

NEWARK, July 4.—"Major" Taylor, the colored cyclone, demonstrated, before the 5,000 people in attendance at the holiday races at the Vailsburg board track to-day that as a match rider he has no superior. Taylor met Jay Eaton in a special match race, and the "Major" won in straight heats. Eaton has beaten the best riders of the country, and match racing is his forte; but Taylor defeated him with perfect ease in both heats to-day.

Eaton went to the front in both heats and gradually unwound his sprint. The "Major" followed him closely, and made no attempt to come out until they both struck the short homestretch, and then, with a startling burst of speed, he quickly forged to the front.

### KISER WINS HALF MILE OPEN.

Eaton failed to qualify in the half mile open, being closed out by Stevens and Newhouse in the first heat. Cooper, Kramer, Taylor and Kiser qualified in the other two heats. The first lap was loaf, when Stevens worked out to the front, Cooper and Kiser following closely. Stevens unwound his sprint and attempted to go the whole last quarter. Newhouse tried to go around on the backstretch, but failed and dropped back. Taylor waited till the turn and then came fast, but was late in making his effort. Kiser came out in the stretch, and putting his every effort in his "Kangaroo" sprint won out over Cooper with Stevens third and Taylor fourth.

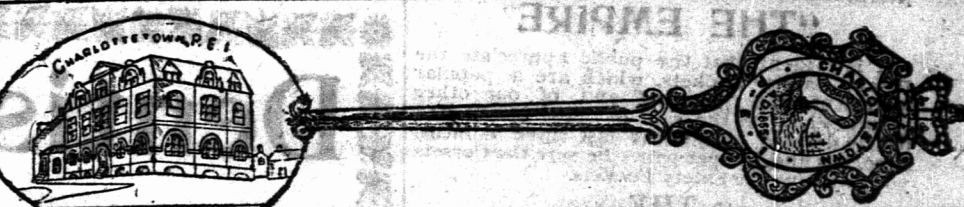
