IN MEMORIAM

MR. PATRICK CURLEY

The death of Mr. Patrick Curley, Auburn, occurred very suddenly at his home on Saturday morning, April 25th. Apparently in his usual good health, he suffered an attack of heart failure, gradually lapsing into unconsciousness from which he never recovered. Very truly has it been said that, even in the midst of life, we are standing at the portals of another world.

The late Mr. Curley was in his 87th year. He was a man of excellent character. By intelligent effort, and by industry, he became one of the most successful farmers in the district. An obliging neighbor, he was deservedly liked by all. Kindly and courteous in manner, both in private and in social life, his death will be regretted, not only in his home but in the community where so many years of usefulness had been spent. Of warm and practical Catholic faith, he was ever diligent in the performance of the duties required by the Church; and, although the end came so suddenly and so unexpectedly, we feel sure that he was not unprepared.

The funeral, which was under the direction of Mr. A. A. Hennessey, was on Tuesday morning to Fort Augustus. It was very largely attended. A High Mass of Requiem was sung by the Rev. D. P. Croken. The choir rendered the funeral service very impressively. Interment was in the cemetery of St. Patrick's Church, beside the grave of his wife, formerly Miss Mary McKeon, who pre-deceased him several years. The pall-bearers were Messrs. John Garland, Edward J. Roche, John Simpson, Damien Lynn, James McKenna, and Joshua Gallant. Numerous Mass Cards, and messages of sympathy were gratefully received.

A family of two sons and four daughters are left to mourn: Edwin on the homestead, Patrick J., in New Jersey, Mrs. Sullivan, and Mary A. in Fall River, Anna, in New York; and Mrs. Walter McEntee, at Auburn. Two brothers, Mr. Thomas Curley, Avondale, Mr. James Curley, Waterville, and a sister, Mrs. Dunn, Charlottetown, also remain. Members of the family residing in the United States who had been notified of their father's death, hastened home; and they had the sad privilege of looking upon the well remembered features and form, once so full of life and gladness, now so cold and still in death.

The Guardian extends sympathy to the family and other relatives in their bereavement and loss. May his soul rest in peace.

Red Cross Launches Annual Campaign

With the mailing of fourteen thousand letters and pieces of literature yesterday the annual Red Cross appeal for membership and financial support was launched throughout the province. The teachers in all the rural schools and the Women's Institutes have been urged to organize the canvass for the Society in the country districts and the town and Red Cross members have been asked to renew their membership. It is hoped that all the adult population of the province will rally to the support of the Red Cross as not since the war has the Society been so greatly in need of funds to carry on its splendid humanitarian work.

A large and enthusiastic committee of ladies will leave a Red Cross envelope for donations at all Charlottetown homes on Saturday to be collected again on Monday or on Tuesday, which is being celebrated as British Empire Red Cross day, and a committee of men will solicit the business firms. At least \$3500 will be needed in the present campaign to meet the needs for the ensuing year but the Executive of the Red Cross is confident that the usual generosity for this worthy work will be forthcoming and that the objective will be reached.

Senator Hughes Makes A Number Of Suggestions

(Canadian Press)

OTTAWA, Ont., May 7.—Reduction in salaries of Civil Servants may be necessary during the present depression, suggested Senator J. J. Hughes, of Prince Edward Island, speaking today in the Senate. The reduction should be general and include the Governor-General as well as the lowest paid office boy. The President and employees of the nationally owned railways also should be included.

In referring to the general distress conditions found in Canada, Senator Hughes noted the country's trade had decreased \$700,000,000 and national revenue had fallen off \$180,000,000. This meant increased taxation, increase in the debt and the strictest economy. But he did not believe in the type of economy that took away automobiles from Cabinet Minister and substituted \$2,000 a year. It might be necessary, Senator Hughes proceeded, to cut the salaries of employees of the Government railways, many of whom were receiving emoluments greater than the traffic would bear under present conditions. Pass privileges and franking rights also should be abolished and an increase made in the income tax payable by wealthy persons.
