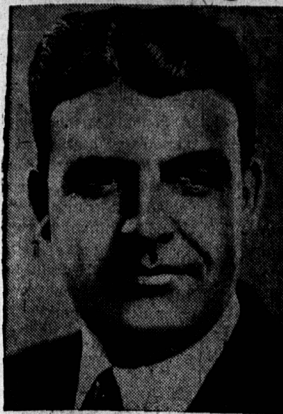

WOMEN OF PERSIA ARE NOW EMANCIPATED

(United Press) TEHERAN, Persia, Sept. 19 — The Government's efforts to "Westernize" Persia were resumed today when Parliament incorporated eugenics and divorce rights for women in the marriage laws.

A law requiring physical examination of men and women before marriage was passed. The minimum marriage was set at 16 for women and 18 for men.

Women were given the unprecedented right to seek divorce for infidelity in husbands.

The public reaction to the new code was not certain, particularly in view of the fact that various earlier laws designed to modernize Persia met such popular opposition that it was necessary to abandon or modify them. The earlier laws related to the rights of women and changes in the national costume.
