SUFFRAGETTES AGAIN AT WORK

Chant Prayers for Prisoners in London Churches

LONDON, Oct. 22, (Special)—Suffragettes again interrupted the services some days ago at St. Paul's and also at St. Luke's, Kensington, where the Bishop of London was preaching, by reciting a prayer for "Mary Richardson and Annie Kenney, who are being forcibly fed."

After the women were ejected from St. Paul's they attempted to hold a meeting on the steps of the cathedral but the police interfered. A scuffle ensued and two women were arrested, charged with assaulting the police.

According to the official report of the militant organization, fifteen American women also went to the cathedral in order to demonstrate their sympathy with their English sisters and to protest against the action of the authorities at New York in preventing Mrs. Pankhurst from landing.

The report also says that the women were ejected with great violence by the vergers.

Similar scenes occurred at the morning services in the Birmingham and Norwich cathedrals. No attempt was made to interfere with the suffragettes, who, when they had finished the litany, quietly walked out in both cases and the services proceeded undisturbed.

GERMANS IRRITATE FRENCH PRESS

Celebration of Famous Battle Causes Annoyance

PARIS, Oct. 22, (Special)—The French press has been more unanimously and loudly anti-German this week than at any time in months, on account of the German celebration of the Battle of Leipsic.

Nearly every great Paris daily has had editorial articles on the subject.

The German celebration will take place next week, with speeches and banquets and the unveiling of the colossal monument costing over \$1,000,000. The French refuse to call the struggle the "Battle of the Nations," but call it "The Battle of the Nations," because it was the French against the confederation of Europe, Le Matin says.

"We celebrate neither Jena, where 10,000 French crushed 70,000 Prussians and captured 200 standards, nor Auerstadt, where 26,000 men, under Davout vanquished 66,000 of Brunswick, nor Lutzen, nor Bautzen, where the Marie Louise Legion cut to pieces 15,000 of Blucher's veterans.

"We celebrate none of the 100 victories gained in Germany 100 years ago. Germany would do well to remember when celebrating the battle of nations, (so called of Leipsic), that only 157,000 French were after a desperate struggle, finally thrown back by 350,000 of the allies."
