
**Contract Bridge**

**MISSING AN EASY ONE**  
 The game contract in the following deal required nothing more complicated than a hold-up play.  
 South dealer. Neither side vulnerable.  
 A 4 3  
 K J 10 8  
 7 6 2  
 10 8 6  
 N  
 W E S  
 Q 7 2  
 K 3 2  
 J 3 5  
 J 10 9  
 A 7 6  
 A 9 8  
 7 5 4 3  
 K 8 6 5  
 Q 9  
 Q 10 4 3  
 A K Q  
 The bidding:  
 South West North East  
 1 NT Pass 2 NT Pass  
 3 NT Pass Pass Pass


Both of South's bids were optimistic, but the contract was logical enough.  
 West, rather than open such a hopeless suit as his clubs, chose to lead the spade jack. South won with the king and started the hearts. West holding up his ace till the third round upon which South discarded a diamond. West returned the spade ten and, without much thought, declarer put up the ace and cashed the last heart. On this trick he had little choice but to let go a spade.  
 The following diamond lead to the ten forced West's ace, but this did South no good. West led his last spade; East won and shifted to clubs. After cashing his club tricks, South had to lead into East's diamond tenace, and the contract was down one.  
 Now observe the difference if South had correctly held up dummy's spade ace when West played the ten. West could do no better than continue with spades (or give South the lead and let him play a third round of spades for himself) and then South could see that spades had broken 3-3 and that his fourth card in the suit was good. Now he could discard a diamond on the fourth heart with impunity, and cash three clubs and the fourth spade for his contract.
