North's raise to three diamonds on the second round was a bad bid. He had opened a hand that was actually a shade short of the requirements, considering that North had no five-card suit and when he gave a direct raise on top of this he was encouraging his partner more than he had the right to do. Having opened, it would have been more logical for North to violate the conventions about rebidding a four-card suit, and to make the less encouraging call of two spades. Such rebids are occasionally forced by circumstances.

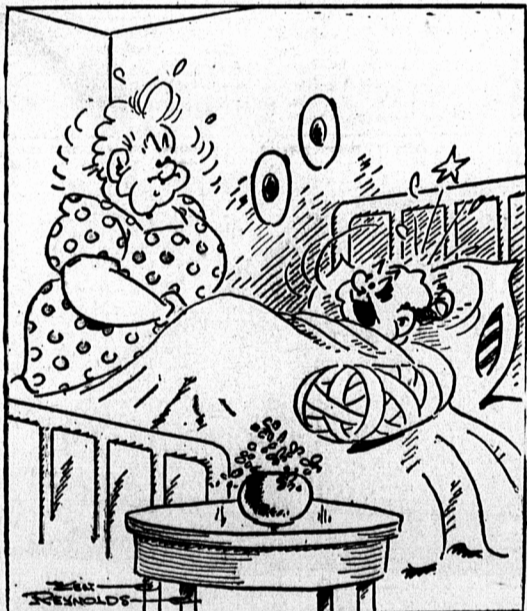
However, things worked out very well. West opened the heart king and continued with the ace. De-

clarer ruffed and promptly led out every one of his trumps, discarding two clubs from dummy. West let go his two worthless spades and one heart; East, forced to hold a spade stopper, and thinking that he had to keep his clubs, abandoned all of his hearts.

Now declarer cashed the three top spades in dummy — and West found himself squeezed! The heart seven was still in dummy, and East could not guard it, therefore, West had to keep a high heart. This, however, reduced him to two clubs and since East had long before come down to the same club length, declarer had no trouble taking the last three, fulfilling tricks with the ace, king, and seven of clubs.

If East had been more imaginative and far-sighted, he would have kept spades and one high heart, relying on West for a club stopper. If this had been the end position—i.e. East holding spades and the high heart; West guarding nothing but clubs—the declarer would have found it impossible to win the twelfth trick.
