

CONDITIONS OF BIBLE STUDY CONTEST

It will be a convenience if students will write their answers on letter paper, about 8 1/2 inches wide, and address the name and address of the writer at the bottom of the answer, so it can be identified, given a number the close of the contest, and forwarded to headquarters for independent examination by competent examiners. 5.
