PLANS LAID FOR AN AERIAL FLEET BY SEC'Y TAFT

Promise of \$200,000 Arouses Enthusiasm in Army—Amount is for the War Balloon Fund—To Begin the Training of the Men

WASHINGTON, D. C., Oct. 31.—General Allen's statement to the International aeronautical congress that Secretary Taft will recommend an appropriation of \$200,000 for an aeronautical branch in the army reflects the importance which the war department gives to the advantages of military ballooning.

The first step in the construction of the government's aerial fleet is made, and, although now far behind European competitors, the United States will take up aeronautics on a large scale, and it is predicted here that within a few years the war department will have a dirigible fleet second to none.

FIGHTING THE BUBONIC PLAGUE AT VANCOUVER

Bounty of Fifty Cents a dozen on Imported Rats at Vancouver

VANCOUVER, B.C., Oct. 31.—Dr. Montzambert, the Dominion health superintendent, has arrived. In discussing the problem of keeping out bubonic plague, several deaths from which occurred at Seattle, he said he would order immediate inspection of trains from Seattle at the international boundary line. All passengers from Seattle will be required to submit to rigorous examination. As an additional precaution, the Board of Health has recommended that a bounty of fifty cents per dozen be placed on rats dead or alive.

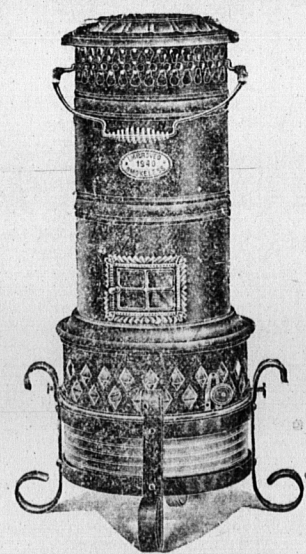

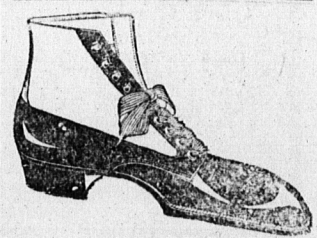
