not appeal to him. He longs to get back to Morell to see the few old faces that are left and to visit the scenes of his boyhood. Mr. Sinnott and his amiable wife gave us a real, old fashioned Island welcome, and we simply had to park our car, stop over Sunday to talk over old times. Mr. Sinnott is a son of the late Clement Sinnott of Morell who, in his day was a noted spar maker for many big ships built at Mt. Stewart. He is a first cousin of Archbishop Sinnott of Winnipeg, and twin brother of the late Patrick Sinnott of Bristol. His two sons are married and his only daughter is the wife of Mr. Carl Madsen, an engineer in the employ of the Union Oil Co., at Los Angeles. Mr. Madsen, who happened to be at Piedmont, kindly showed us over the College grounds at Berkeley, from which he graduated, and explained everything. The Stadium has a seating capacity of 80,000 and they intend putting on another story to make it 125,000. These American people are strong on education and athletics and simply go wild at a game of football, shouting for, and betting on, their favorite team. But there is one thing they seem to be unable to do, and that to our mind is a very important matter. It is stated that only five per cent. of the students in U. S. High Schools have any idea of what they are going to do after leaving college. That means that they have no goal in life. Their time is so taken up with book studies, preparing for exams, football and other sports that they seem to have no time to study the serious, or what their life's work will be. To succeed nowadays students require something more than passing exams. Without a goal they are liable to just drift along through life without any particular port in view. The student who early in life examines himself to find the position he is best qualified to fill and works to that end is far more likely to be a success than one who has no goal. Helen Keller without sight, speech, or hearing, qualified for a university degree and the discussion of "esoteric theology". The founder of the A. and P. stores was a grocer's clerk and started in a little shop which has grown to fifteen thousand branches. Herbert Hoover, the President of this Great Republic, an orphan thrown upon his own resources at the age of ten, is a good example of what a thinker with a goal can accomplish. He is still a thinker, working out plans for the betterment of his people. Chas. M. Schwab, the great steel magnate, started as engineer's helper at \$1 per day. Then there is David May, an eleven year old immigrant boy unable to speak a word of English, but in the end owned six great department stores. We could name many more thinkers who had a goal and succeeded, and are convinced that getting students to think and have a goal in life is far more likely to bring results than football prowess or high class standing.

From Modesto southward there is irrigation and the country looks good. This is a great 2 1/2 inch section and many factories are putting up prunes, raisins and other fruit for the world's market. It is also a great milk producing and ranching section but awful warm in summer. Cotton is also largely grown here. We passed thousands of acres of cotton ready for the pickers while much was seen in bales at many warehouses ready for shipment. The estimate this year is about 250,000 bales. Near Bakersfield are many oil wells pumping day and night. Other wells are near Santa Barbara, Sante fe Springs, Signal Hill and Huntington Beach, and other places. Last week California produced an average of 698,700 bbls. of crude oil per day. Multiply this by 365 and you have a fair estimate of its yearly production. I am, Sir, etc.

lent to make such frequent electoral appeals. Accordingly all the Provinces except Ontario and Prince Edward Island have adopted the five-year term, though election appeals have since been quite as frequent under the five year as under the four year system. The one exception to this has been Nova Scotia, where the Murray and Armstrong Governments almost always took the full five years. This was not very remarkable, when one recalls the reactionary attitude that took possession of the old Nova Scotia regime in its latter years.

One of the most extraordinary incidents in provincial politics in recent times, was the strong public protest asserted in 1928 by the Nova Scotia Liberal Opposition against the Rhodes Government's essentially democratic appeal to the electorate when only 3 years had elapsed since the preceding election. Brief intervals between elections are of the very essence of responsible government. Short accountings, as the old saying expresses it, make for long friendships. There is solid ground for criticism against a Government for deferring an appeal to the people be forced to do so by effluxion of time. On the other hand a Government is to be applauded when it shows its sense of responsibility and trust of the people by reasonably frequent appeals. And it is noteworthy that Conservative Governments have as a rule been much more prompt than Liberal Governments in placing their records before the electorate, and have been less inclined to cling to office till driven to the country by the letter of the constitution.
