The personal touch of sympathy conveyed by such a card helps the receiver to feel that the home people are not unmindful of the sacrifices they have made on our behalf, and is well worth the additional labor and expense it involves. As the Society cannot take the money paid for the adoption of prisoners, for this purpose, they will be glad to receive special donations, however small, to help defray the cost. They have now two hundred and eighty-four prisoners adopted in this Province, which is about one tenth of the whole number, and are anxious to complete the three hundred before July 1st. Contributions may be sent to the Treasurer, Canon Simpson, Charlottetown, who will also be glad to furnish any information on the subject of adoptions.
