MAIL ORDERS.

For some time we have been reading the articles in some of our CharloTTetown newspapers referring to the people of our Province dealing with Mail Order Houses in preference to our local stores. We think it is only fair to ourselves as well as to the purchasing public to mention a few facts along these lines, more particularly in connection with our furniture and house furnishing business. Over two years ago we determined to offer the public the goods we handle, that is to say furniture, carpets, oilcloths, bedding, lace curtains, draperies, table and bed linens, towels and towelling, and in fact everything for the house, at prices as low or lower than any Mail Order house in Canada. To do this we went to a great deal of expense and issued a large number of letters, circulars, pamphlets and catalogues, so as to impress the public with the fact that we were prepared to meet and beat any competition. Before issuing these notices to the public we had made arrangements with a number of manufacturers to procure from them such goods as we might require at prices almost as favorable as the largest buyers in Canada. A large number of our purchases (excepting furniture) were made in England and other places outside of Canada, and we could bring these goods to P. E. I. at smaller freight charges than could a like buyer in Toronto or Montreal. We were therefore in a position to sell our goods and are now selling them to our customers, who had received our letters or advertisements, at such prices as immensely pleased them, and so long as they continue to stand by us we will guarantee to supply them to better advantage than they can receive from any mail order house—bar none. We have invited and do now again invite intending purchasers to bring along their catalogues of furniture, etc., and we guarantee to match the offers made. We wish however to draw special attention to a fact which many catalogue students overlook—namely, that one of these mail order houses will pay freight on furniture—no matter how large the order may be—but we offer to pay the freight anywhere. We frequently pay freight charges on furniture coming to P. E. I. as high as 25 and 30 per cent., or \$30.00 on \$100 worth of goods, and seldom do we ever get a lower freight than 10 per cent. Again we receive thousands of packages of furniture in P. E. I. on any order of ten dollars (\$10.00) or over. Now a little information just here may not hurt annually, and more than half of them reach us in a damaged condition, so that we have to keep our cabinet makers continually repairing damage. Now we want to ask the public when reading a catalogue to first add to the advertised price the freight, 10 per cent to 30 per cent. Second allow for the broken mirror or the legless chair. Third remember we deliver free, and fourth we show you the goods before you part with your money, and we do not ask you to wait three, four or even six

weeks for your goods. Any person wishing to compare their catalogue with our goods, will receive the most courteous treatment. We believe, Mr Editor, that it is the duty of the press to point out to the public this fact—that the moment they mail their cash to the mail order house they become prejudiced in favor of the goods they have sent for, because they know they have to like them whether they suit or not. The merchants of P. E. I. do not ask the people to buy in this way—but have to deliver the goods before they see the money and have to stand behind the goods and guarantee them for ever or so long as they are in business. If the people of P. E. I. do not stand by the merchants, the day will surely come when they will have to buy all their goods from Mail Order houses, and CharloTTetown instead of being a ready market for all kinds of produce would soon become a dead town.

A SEVERE BLOW FOR REPUBLICANS.

ROCHESTER, N. Y., April 20—Between 10,000 and 15,000 voters of Monroe County changed from the Republican to the Democratic column today and elected the first Democratic congressman that has represented the thirty-second district in twenty years.

James S. Havens, a Democrat, running on a tariff reform platform, defeated George W. Aldridge, for a score of years the ruler of the county Republican organization, by 5,200 votes. Monroe County, which comprises the thirty-second district, is normally Republican about 4,000. James Brock Perkins, whose death in the middle of his third congressional term necessitated a special election today, carried the district in 1908 by 10,167 votes.

Havens had arrayed against him one of the strongest political organizations in the state. Yet, in a campaign lasting but seven days, and with hastily constructed machinery, he accomplished one of the most remarkable upturns in political history. The result of this election takes its place beside the Democratic victory in the fourteenth Massachusetts district, where Eugene N. Pess was sent to congress from a district supposed to be as rock-ribbed Republican as this one.

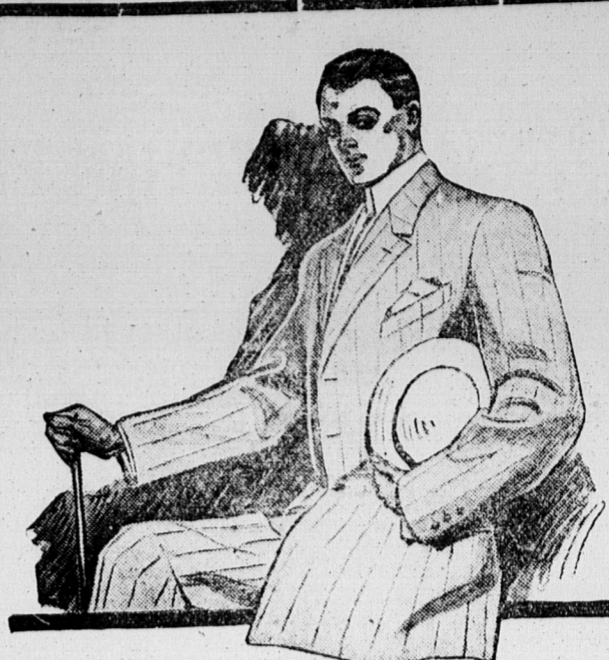
