With the decision of the amusement question delegates of the Methodist Episcopal General Conference at Minneapolis made rapid strides in the completion of the business of the session. By a vote of 446 to 369 the conference voted to leave unchanged the church discipline, paragraph 26 which prohibits dancing, card playing and kindred amusements. This movement of the conference has been watched with interest in provincial religious circles and the outcome will, it is thought, give universal satisfaction among the people of the church here.

The German cruiser Bremen, arrived Saturday morning and her arrival was a surprise as there had been no announcement that this port was to be favored with a visit from a vessel of the Kaiser's navy. She came up the harbor between 7 and 8 o'clock. The Bremen has not been in home waters for two years. She was in Montreal last summer and has also been in southern waters, and on the Atlantic and Pacific oceans. She comes here from Newport (R. I.), and was recently at Panama. She sails Tuesday.—St. John exc. (The Bremen visited Charlottetown last year.)

A despatch from Digby, N. S., states that Capt. John Apt, master of the Digby fishing schooner Albert J. Lutz, bound from Yarmouth for the Magdalen Islands via Canso, has put into Shelburne. He sent the owners in Digby the following despatch today: "Thursday night at 10.30 we ran into by an unknown steamer 60 miles east of Cape Sable. My vessel at the time was logging ten knots. In the collision we lost our main-boom and mainsail. Hull not injured. "We certainly had a narrow escape from being sunk with all hands. The fog was very thick and there was a strong breeze at the time of the disaster." It is thought that this is the vessel struck by the steamer A. W. Perry while the latter was enroute to Halifax from Charlottetown.

SPANKED HIS WIFE ALLENTOWN, Pa., May 20.—Attorney Alfred S. Hartzell, appointed master in a divorce suit, says in a report to the court that a husband sometimes is justified in beating his wife. The report was made in the suit against Robert A. Clewell. The wife brought by Mrs. Fannie J. Clewell alleged cruel and barbarous treatment. Testimony was given that she, without justification, had accused her husband of infidelity, whereupon he, without arguing, placed her across his knee and used his slipper to spank her. In his report Attorney Hartzell wrote: "Corporal chastisement of a wife by a husband, when provoked by false accusations of infidelity, may be held to be disciplinary rather than abusive. The master also finds it difficult to sympathize very deeply with one who received it, it is by no means our purpose to justify acts of personal violence in the abstract, and as between husband and wife especially such occurrences are unspcakably deplorable." ten-ten
