Believed Was Murdered By Fellow-Countrymen For His Money—Had Fifty Dollars When Last Seen and No Money Was Found on Body

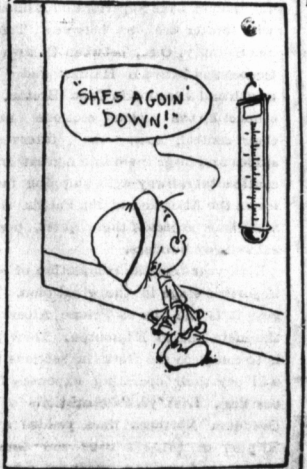
