Dominion Illustration Station Field Day 1943

You are cordially invited to attend the Field Days which will be held on your Dominion Government Illustration Station

IONA—On farm of W. E. Daley on Monday, July 6

ALLISTON—on farm of T. A. Hicken on Tuesday, July 7

Our meetings are organized by the Division of Illustration Stations, Dominion Experimental Farms Service, in co-operation with the other Services and the Provincial Department of Agriculture.

At the above Field Day, a tour of the farm will be made and a detailed description given of each field treatment. A number of experiments are under study at each Station comparing different fertilizers on roots, corn, potato and grain. The effect of Nitrogenous fertilizers on timothy meadows and the effect of chemical fertilizers on pasture are further demonstrated.

Many successful Field Days have been held in the past at this Station and in view of Canada's special War Effort we are looking forward to having a still better Field Day this year.
