FORMER ISLANDER.—In the annual mid winter number of the "Los Angeles Times" appears the following: "The daily boats to Catalina Island continue to be crowded. An extensive building and improvement program, intended to mould this Island after the architectural patterns of pleasure centres of the Mediterranean shores of Italy, France, and Spain, was ordered last year by its owner, William Wrigley, Jr. "David M. Renton, his general manager, received instructions in November to begin work at once. The project includes a magnificent new country club house and health-development establishment; terminal building and ferry slip on the bay front, with pergola walks leading to various points in Avalon; a new Greek theatre with parquet floor for dancing; a Spanish village for housing of Mexican labourers; miles of scenic boulevards, and jetty-protected pergola sand beaches." (Mr. David M. Renton referred to is a son of the late John Renton of Georgetown, and a cousin of Mr. Thomas Renton of the Canadian National Railways. Mr. Renton has won marked success as a contractor and builder in California and the fact that he is general manager for the multi-millionaire Mr. Wrigley of international fame, is quite a tribute to his ability.)

THE MARKETS

(Canadian Press)
MONTREAL, Que., May 2.—With the exception of some demand for odd loads of wheat, oats and barley the export trade in grain here today was quiet. A feature of the domestic trade was the weaker feeling that developed in Canadian western oats and prices were reduced one cent per bushel. Owing to the further weakness in the cash wheat situation at Winnipeg the undertone to the market for spring wheat grades of flour was easier, but no actual change in prices was announced. The local and foreign demand was quiet. The tone of the winter wheat flour market was firm under a slow demand. The trade in all lines of millfeed continued active under a continued good demand from United States buyers. The undertone to the market was firm. There was no change in standard grades of rolled oats and business was quiet. The egg market was moderately active and prices for all grades were firmly maintained. The receipts were 3227 cases. The demand for potatoes continued of a limited character and the undertone was easy. Extreme dullness marked the trade in imported beans but prices were unchanged. The feature of the butter trade was the further weakness that prevailed and prices declined another 1-2 c. to 3-4 cents per lb. This was attributed to the limited demand and the large supplies coming forward. The receipts were 515 packages. There was practically no demand for cheese and the market was dull and weaker. The receipts were 653 boxes.

OTTAWA, May 2.—There is no change reported from Canadian egg markets today.

TORONTO.—The local market is firm with prices unchanged.

MONTREAL.—This egg market is unchanged in tone and prices. There is a good demand for extras and firsts for storage purposes.
