The Wonderful British Empire

Some Facts, Great And Small, For Empire Day

The British Empire is the greatest political fact in the world.

It is the greatest political fact the world has ever seen.

It is the most extensive Empire the world has ever seen.

Its area is about 14,000,000 miles, or 1-4 of the earth's land surface.

It is 7 times as large as the Roman Empire at the time of its greatest extent under Trajan.

It is 4 times the size of the United States proper. It would make 65 Germanys.

It has increased by about 4,000,000 square miles during the last 60 years.

This is an area larger than the United States, including possessions, or than all the continent of Europe.

The Empire includes the ancient United Kingdom, the mighty Dominion of Canada, the giant Commonwealth of Australia, the vast Union of South Africa, the splendid Empire of India, among its states.

It is really an Empire of empires.

Its states and provinces are found on every continent and in every ocean.

Its islands, scattered over the Globe both in salt and fresh water seas, are without number.

Canada alone is nearly as large as all Europe; Canada is larger than the United States with all its possessions. Australia is as large as Brazil, or as the United States proper.

British South Africa is larger than Argentina, or than the United States east of the Mississippi.

India is as large as all Europe, excluding Russia; it would make about 40 states of Pennsylvania.

Of the Empire's area about 8,000,000 square miles are new countries—the bulk of the world's new countries are British.

These new lands have about 20,000,000 inhabitants—they could sustain 300,000,000.

It is therefore the great future country of the world—the 'Greatest United States.'

The Empire is the largest landowner on the Continent of Africa.

It is the largest landowner in the Eastern Hemisphere.

It is the largest landowner in the Western Hemisphere.

It is the largest landowner in North America.

It owns more of Central America than any other non-Central American country.

It owns more of South America than any other non-South American country.

It possesses more of the coast line of the Atlantic, Pacific, and Indian oceans than any other Power.

The greatest section of the Empire is in North America, the smallest in South America.

It is the most populous Empire the world has ever seen—about 450,000,000, 1-4 of mankind.

It includes more races, languages, and religions than any other Empire that has ever existed.

It has the greatest Hindu population of the world, and the greatest Moslem.

The majority holding the ancient Persian religion of Zoroaster are now British citizens in India, the Persia.

India alone has more different races and languages than the whole of Europe.

The British Empire is the greatest human society ever seen upon earth.

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Palestine, the Holy Land, is now under its sway—Judaea, Samaria, Galilee.

It includes the old capital of Queen Candace, now in the Sudan, with the greater part of her old kingdom of Ethiopia.

It has within its boundaries large parts of the once mighty Empires of Assyria, Babylonia, Persia; of Alexander, of Rome, of the Great Mogul.

It contains most of the newest state of the world, e. g. New Zealand, Queensland, Saskatchewan, Alberta, Rhodesia, Kenya.

It has the largest island of the world, Australia.

It has the highest mountain in Africa, Kilimanjaro in Tanganyika.

It has the highest of the Rockies, Mont Logan in Yukon.

The highest mountain range in the world, the Himalayas, is largely within its borders.

Among its mountains are Hor, Flagah, Tabor, Carmel, Sinai is under its protection.

It has within its borders the largest inland sea after the Mediterranean, Hudson Bay.

This is a Canadian Mediterranean—large as 3 Baltics.

Other great seas, the shores of which are all or nearly all within its borders, are—the Arabian Sea, the Bay of Bengal, the Gulf of St. Lawrence, the Gulf of Carpentaria, the Coral Sea, the Tasman Sea.

There are six great white states of the Empire on the Pacific coast, 1 in Canada, 5 in Australia.

These Empire Pacific states are longer and more populous than the 4 Pacific states of the United States.

The 2 chief cities of the European race on the Pacific coast are in the Empire, Sydney and Melbourne.

A recent Australian Premier said—"The heart of the Empire has been moved from the North Sea to the Pacific."

Many of the world's greatest rivers flow wholly or partly within its borders.

The Nile, Niger, Indus, Brahmaputra, Zambezi, Irrawadi, Ganges, the Murray, in the Eastern Hemisphere.

The Mackenzie, St. Lawrence, Saskatchewan, Columbia, Yukon, in the Western.

Also such historic rivers and streams as the Euphrates, Tigris, Jordan, Kishon, Jabbeek, and Arnon are under its mandate or protection.

It contains or partly contains, the largest lakes in the world—Superior, Huron, Ontario, Erie, Tanganyika, Nyasa.

The other great lakes Victoria, Nyanza, Great Bear, Great Slave, and Winnipeg are entirely within it.

It has the largest mercantile marine on the great North American lakes.

It has fleets of steamers trading up and down the Central American lakes. The Dead Sea is completely within its borders the Sea of Galilee is partly within them.

Canada has half the fresh water of the earth.

Many of the world's natural wonders are within the Empire or on its borders—e. g. Niagara, Victoria, Kaitiaki, among waterfalls.

Kini Balu (Borneo), Roraima (South America), Ruwenzori (the old 'Mountains of the Moon,' (Uganda), Egon (Kenya), among wonderful mountains.

The 'Rotorua' wonders in New Zealand are among the world's chief natural ones.

The Victoria Falls, Rhodesia, is the grandest in the world.

Kaitiaki, British Guiana, is the highest great waterfall in the world.

Labrador possesses one of the most magnificent waterfalls in the world, the Grand Falls of the Hamilton River.

The Empire has one the world's chief oceanic wonders, the Great Barrier Reef off the coast of Australia. There is nothing like it in the world.

This is a gigantic coral breakwater, 1,200 miles long, making smooth water along the whole east coast of Queensland.

British Columbia has one of the longest and most beautiful landlocked ocean routes in the world.

The Empire holds most of the great 'Gates' of the world—Gibraltar, Suez, Aden, Singapore, Quebec.

Indian Govt. Orders Planes

(British United Press)

LONDON, May 23.—The announcement that the Indian government has ordered a fleet of monoplane air liners for the operation of internal airways in India marks a new and important stage in the development of Empire air communications. For the first time the principle of unified control, fulfilled in the monoplane operation by Imperial Airways of the existing lines radiating from London to the east and Africa, is broken.

The experiment is interesting only events can show whether the Indian government is right or wrong in refusing to budge from insistence that internal airways in the territory over which it rules must be state controlled.

From the end of this year, when the present agreement chartering Imperial Airways aeroplanes for the continuation of the air mail from Karachi to Delhi is due to expire, the British company will be faced with a gap, between Calcutta and Karachi, in the proposed service to Australia. Undoubtedly the Indian government will permit Imperial Airways craft to carry mails and passengers embarked outside India to destinations beyond India as Dutch and French machines do today, but they will not countenance the carriage of internal traffic along the main routes by any aeroplanes except their own.

The alternative is for the Indian aeroplanes to be responsible for the transport of the mails from Karachi to Calcutta. Here difficulties might arise from differences of size and loading of the machines employed. For example, should one of the new giant four-engined Handley Page biplanes reach Karachi from the west with 6,000 pounds or more of load on board several smaller planes might be required to take the load across India without delay.

The machines ordered by the Indian government are three-engined "Avro Ten" high-wing biplanes, a single pair of wings being located above the fuselage, with space in the cabin for eight passengers and served by a crew of two or three men. They cruise at 100 miles an hour and are designed to operate in India with sufficient fuel on board for flights non stop of 800 miles, a range necessary because some of the stages contemplated in the regular operation of air ways in India are more than 600 miles long. Each machine is powered with three 20 h. p. Armstrong-Siddeley "Lynx" air-cooled engines.

PARIS LETTER

PARIS, May 23 (U.P.)—The plight of exiled royal princes in France was revealed in all its drama and pathos when the young Archduke Otto, heir of the Hapsburg throne at Budapest held a recent conversation with the Infante Gonzales at Fontainebleau.

The Spanish princes, three of them with their two Princess sisters, have the run of the beautiful forest of Fontainebleau, and the rigors of their princely training has somewhat abated since Alfonso renounced power at Madrid.

Young Otto, who since birth has been raised and trained for the throne, visited his royal relatives and looked wistfully at their sisters and brothers, riding and walking about with all the freedom of ordinary children.

Otto Envis Cousins "You've got all the luck," the serious faced, rather good looking Otto told the young Gonzales. "Although we are going to stay in Paris. We come here so seldom that I hardly know the city."

And to those immediate members of his family, young Otto, is already King of Hungary. Last November he attained the age of 18, which is the legal age in Hungary. His ambitious and ill-starred mother, the Empress Zita, has contrived every means to have him placed on the throne. And so this lad, who has lived to man's estate, almost without a childhood, without the distractions of youth, is a King without reigning, and on him are thrown the responsibilities of leadership without its authority. 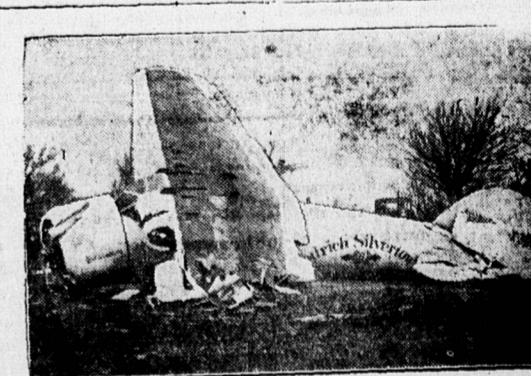
