—The latest news, first of all.

—The Editor of La Partida, Tignish, was in Summerside, Tuesday and went east to Rustico.

—Ronald Campbell, Summerside, left yesterday on a business trip to Campbellton, N. B.

—John M. Clark, Summerside, returned last evening from a business trip to St. John, N. B.

—Angus McSweeney, Summerside, crossed by the Empress Tuesday. He is on a trip to Boston and New York.

—There were one hundred and twenty passengers going outward from Summerside by the Empress yesterday and sixty returning.

—The Empress brought over twenty-one head of milk cattle en route from St. John, N. B., to Pownal for Mr. Lawton who has purchased a farm there.

—W. S. Garrison, the man who had the misfortune to have his leg broken sometime ago at the London show at Summerside, is able to get up and expects by the first of October to be among the farmers again soliciting orders for fruit and ornamental trees.

—The Hon. John Richards, Bideford, returned last evening from an extended trip to western Canada. He reports the crops all through the Northwest as being good. He says that harvest is later than reported here, very little grain to be seen cut anywhere.

—The marriage took place at Indian River on the twenty-fourth inst., by the Rev. Mons. Gills of Emma Emerson, of Freetown, to Jeremiah Norman of Indian River. Also at the same time and place by the same Minister, Miss Maggie Grover of Spring Valley, to H. J. DeBlois, of Boston, Mass.

—The marriage took place at the home of the bride's parents, James and Mrs. Harris, Summerside, last evening of M. S. H. B. Harris and W. K. Llewellyn, Summerside. Rev. R. G. Strathie was the officiating clergyman. The wedding was a very quiet one notwithstanding that the young couple are very popular.

—The motor boat race will be the principal attraction in Summerside on Monday Forenoon, Aug. 30th, and the horse races in the afternoon. The boat race is open to all owners of boats in Prince Co. A valuable cup will be the most important prize awarded, but there will be other prizes which will give chances to all to win something.

—At the adjourned court held by the Returning Officer yesterday at Summerside the Sheriff made a further adjournment till Tuesday the 31st. No business was transacted. There appears to be some trouble. It is said that the Sheriff's duty was to hold his court at some date not less than eleven days and not exceeding sixteen days, but he figured the time from nomination day instead of the day of the polling. When Sheriff Wright's attention was called to the matter he considered it advisable to further adjourn the Court until the 31st in order to obtain independent advice on the matter. When the Court reassembles the Returning Officer will again cast up the votes and hear objections to votes being polled in the wrong poll and will ignore all that was done on the 23rd inst., as being void. All this will still leave undetermined the knotty question as to whether his court is properly adjourned to the 31st inst or not, and whether he can legally transact business thereat. If he cannot, then he cannot declare Mr. Delaney elected. This is a curious complication indeed.

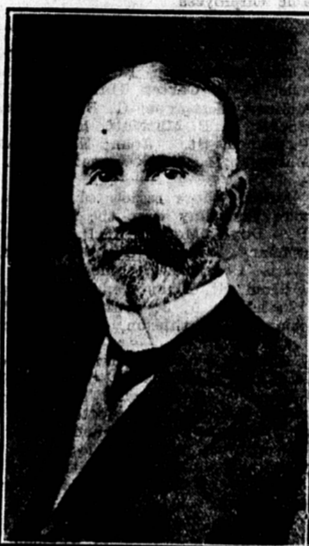

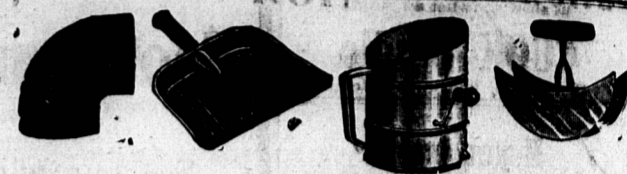

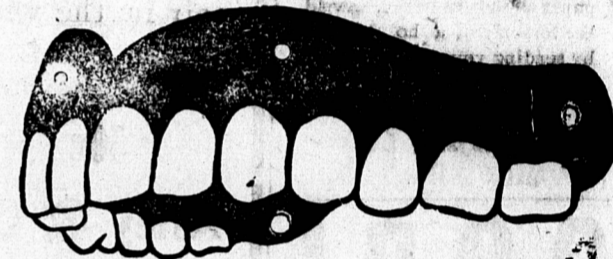
