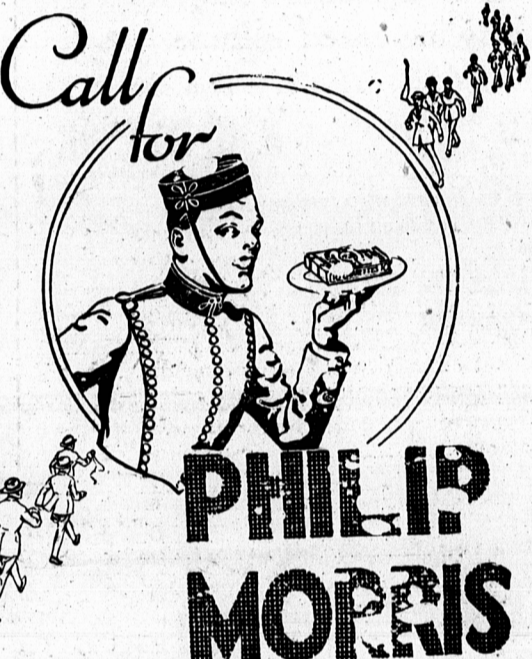

DOMINION WOOL MARKET REPORT

For Week Ended June 23rd, 1921

No change in wool prices has been noted during the past week in Canada, but trading has been of such small extent that quotations are only nominal. Some small lots of Eastern Domestic wools have been sold at prices ranging from 13c for coarse to 25c for mediums. Local buyings are small and at very low prices.

The United States reports indicate a more cheerful tone to the market there with a slight advance in prices. The English market is reported stronger, prices having advanced somewhat during the past month.

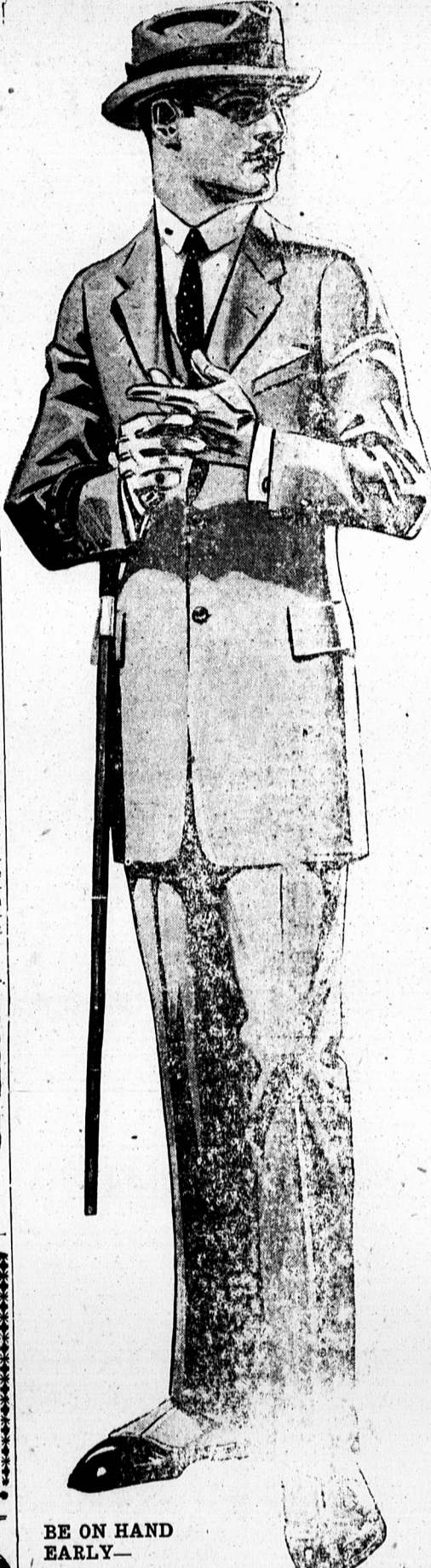
