THE EDITOR'S MAIL.

A Question of Doctrine.

Sir.—In your report of Rev. D. B. Macleod's sermon to the Forest r's you represent him as saying: "They will be done." "We are not to understand the will of God as Creator and Law giver, but His will as our Saviour. As our Redeemer God is not willing that any should perish but that they should come to repentance. His will is that all should honor the Son as they honor the Father."

Does Mr Macleod mean to say that God has one will as Creator and Law-giver and another in the sending of His Son to finish the work, of his Father? Or that God has an old and a new will? We are taught by the Standards of our church that God is a Spirit infinite, eternal, unchangeable, & that with Him there is no variableness or shadow of turning and from our knowledge of Scripture and our acquaintance with the various shades of thinking we consider it safer for public speakers to be well guarded, especially when touching upon the nature or attributes of God.

Jesus Christ came not to do His own will but the will of Him that sent me. Hence it is the will of God as Creator and Law giver and Redeemer, all in one, that all men should come to repentance and believe, and turn. This is the eternal, unchangeable and continual will of God revealed in Christ more fully and explicitly; and not as an after plan or thought as seems to be implied in your report of said sermon.
