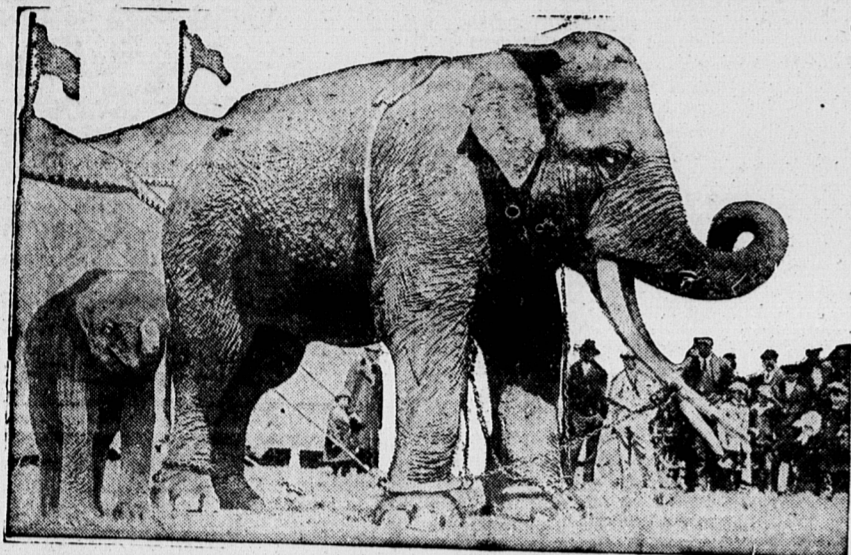

PRESBYTERY MEETING—The Presbytery of Prince Edward Island will meet in special session at 2 p. m. on Thursday, July 17th in the Keir Memorial Presbyterian Church, Malpeque, to deal with a call from Chatham, Ontario, to Rev. M. Scott Fulton, D.D. of Zion Church, Charlottetown. Following the meeting of Presbytery, there will be a picnic at the beach. The ladies of the Presbyterian Church, Malpeque, are preparing supper. All the minister students, catechists and elders, together with their friends are invited to be present.

H. M. S. WISTARIA—His Honor Lieutenant Governor Heartz has received word from the new Commander-in-Chief of the America and West Indies Station, V. H. S. Haggard, a nephew of the late Sir Ryder Haggard, to the effect that the H. M. S. 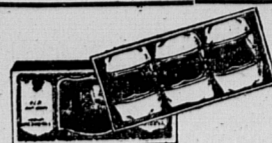
