In today's deal South got himself into a very tight spot by ignoring the Principle of Preparation.

North dealer. Both sides vulnerable.

West made the sound assumption that since his partner had passed originally, a game was virtually out of the question for his side, and therefore that his best chance for a substantial profit was to keep quiet and try to trap the opponents.

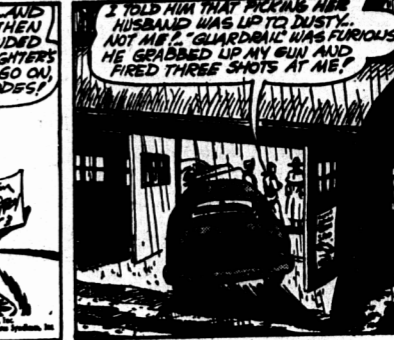
The club six was the opening lead. Dummy's king was played, and South led a heart toward his own diamond jack. This insured seven tricks and an 800-point penalty for the defense.

This highly unpleasant outcome for North-South was attributable to South's unwise choice of opening bids. He should have started with one heart, so that he could show his diamond suit without "reversing" over North's one spade response. South could then have bid two diamonds and West scarcely would have doubted that bid.
