COUNT INOUE
LEAVES BERLIN
 May Be Succeeded By
 Viscount Aoki, Washington.

BERLIN, Sept. 13.—Count Inoue, the Japanese Ambassador to Germany, has taken his farewell of the Imperial Chancellor Prince Von Buelow, at Norddorney, preparatory to returning to Japan.

His successor has not yet been appointed, although it is asserted, that Viscount Aoki, the Ambassador of Japan at Washington, will be transferred here. Count Inoue is reputed to have a thorough knowledge of German aims and policies, which would make him a valuable advisor at home. The attribute for which he will principally be remembered in Germany is the extreme amibility with which he has overcome all embarrasments. His most notable diplomatic achievements while in Berlin probably was that of impressing the Foreign Office with the idea that Japan was quiet willing that Germany should retain Kiao Chau, the territory on the Shan Tung peninsula leased by Germany from China in 1898, because from the Japanese standpoint, so long as Germany retains territorial interests in the Far East she can be more easily dealt with after the Anglo-Japanese alliance expires.

SENDING FLEET
TO PACIFIC COSTS

WASHINGTON, Sept. 13.—Two hundred and fifty-three thousand tons of coal, exclusive of that to be shipped in government colliers, will be required to get the Atlantic battleship fleet to the Pacific coast and properly coal it at Mare Island, according to the estimates made by the equipment bureau of the navy department, which has called for proposals for supplying the necessary fuel. Of this aggregate, 133,000 tons are semi-bituminous, and the remainder Welsh coal.

CANADIAN SURTAX
HITS GERMANY
 German Exports Feil Off
 Largely Owing to the Preference.

MONTREAL, Sept. 13.—The Star's London correspondent cables: A German official green book on the details of Canadian trade was received here today. It admits that German exports to Canada were heavily hit finally by the preference and still more by the surtax. The total trade has fallen from \$12,000,000 to \$9,500,000 between 1902 and 1906. The fall was especially heavy in German sales in Canada being reduced from \$9,500,000 to \$6,000,000.

NO CHANGE IN
THANKSGIVING DAY

Petition for Monday Instead of
 Thursday Will Be Refused.

OTTAWA, Sept. 13.—A deputation from the Commercial Travellers' Association waited on the members of the government today and asked that Thanksgiving day be held on a Monday instead of Thursday as at present. While no definite answer was given the deputation, it is understood that there will be no change this year, and that Thanksgiving day will take place on a Thursday, the same as has always been the custom in Canada as well as in the States and Britain.

ADJUDGED
A LUNATIC

NEW YORK, Sept. 13.—Edward W. Vanderbilt, the aged retired merchant, of Brooklyn, who married May S. Pepper, the spiritualistic medium, is incapable of managing his affairs because of insanity according to a verdict returned by a sheriff's jury in Brooklyn, today. An application for the appointment of a guardian for Mr. Vanderbilt was granted. The proceedings were brought by his daughter, Miss Minerva Vanderbilt, after Mr. Vanderbilt had married Mrs. Pepper several months ago, and had given to her a large portion of the real estate which he owned in Brooklyn, including the house in which they lived.
 Miss Vanderbilt asserted that her inheritance rights were being disregarded and that she had been left without a home.
 A brother and sister of Mr. Vanderbilt subsequently joined her in the appeal to the court.

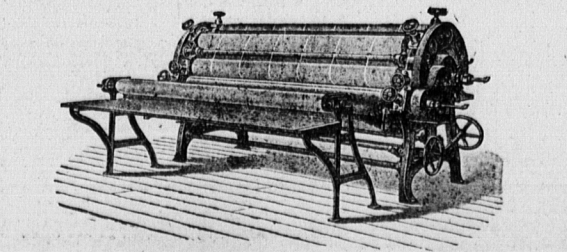
