MONTREAL, Sept. 28.—Dominion livestock report cattle receipts 1,305. A number of loads of steers were sold for export at prices ranging from \$3.50 to \$7.50. A few choice heiferish cows were also sold for export at a top of \$5.00. Butcher cattle were moving at prices ranging from \$4. to \$6.50. Cows were from \$3. to \$4.50 with few tops at \$5. The standard quotation on bulls was \$2.75 for those weighing less than 550 pounds and \$3.25 for bulls over that weight. Quotations butcher steers good, \$6.50 to \$7.50, medium \$5.25 to \$6.25, common \$4.00 to \$5.00. Butcher heifers good \$5.75 to \$6.50, medium \$4.50 to \$5.50, common \$3.50 to \$4.25. Butcher cows good \$4.50, medium \$3.00 to \$4.00, canners \$2.00, cutters \$2.75 to \$3.25, calf receipts 1,923. There was keen demand for the few veals offered and prices ranged from \$9. to \$9.50 for a top of \$11 for odd ones picked out. Grassers brought from \$4.25 to \$5, and pail calves from \$3.50 to \$8, according to weight and finish.

Quotations good veal \$10.00 to \$11.00, medium \$9.00 to \$10.00, common \$6.00 to \$8.00, grass \$4.25 to \$5.00. Sheep receipts 6,709. There were several carloads of good quality lambs on sale today and good lots, bucks included, brought \$11.50. Straight carloads of medium and fairly good lambs brought \$11. to \$11.25 and culms \$10.50 to \$11. Sheep were \$4. to \$6.50. Two hundred and forty ewe and wether lambs were sold for \$11.75. Quotations: Ewes \$4.00 to \$5.50, lambs good \$11.50 to \$11.75, common \$10.00 to \$11.00. Hog receipts 1,429. Hogs sold in mixed lots brought \$13.25 and \$13.50 for those of good weight and quality. Selects \$13.75 and sows \$10.25 to \$11, or better.

Islander Has Narrow Escape

Among the members of the crew of the ill-fated United States dingy "Shenandoah" which crashed to earth in China over three weeks ago, with a heavy loss of life, was Pilot Frederick J. Tobin, Mr. Tobin is a son of Mrs. Margaret J. Tobin, formerly Miss Margaret O'Brien, daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. John O'Brien of Bristol, Prince Edward Island.

Pilot Tobin had a miraculous escape from death, having fallen on the tree tops.

Letters from Mrs. Tobin to her sister Mrs. James A. O'Brien, Montreal, and her brother, Mr. John T. O'Brien, Bristol, state that after Fred fell on the tree tops, a part of the rigging caught in his clothing and carried him off again through the air. Once more he became disengaged from the plane and fell to the earth from an altitude of 100 feet, and was picked up by a passing plane, and at once carried to safety.

After a day of terrible suspense Mrs. Tobin was getting ready to go to Lakehurst, where she received news of her son's safety.

Both Mr. and Mrs. O'Brien, aunt and uncle of Mr. Tobin, are very proud of his escape, and of the honor that will now be his. Prince Edward Island also has need to be proud of her grandson, (as she can claim him through his mother, Mr. Tobin was next to the late Capt. Lansdowne. If there is another Shenandoah constructed Pilot Tobin may be first in command.

The Boston Post of September 14th contains a photo of Pilot Tobin, and the following notice: Frederick J. Tobin, a member of the crew of the Shenandoah who is reported safe, is well known in Arlington, where he formerly lived. He is the son of Mrs. Margaret J. Tobin of 6 Russell Terrace, Arlington. He has been in the United States navy for 12 years.

He was married two years ago, and besides his wife, who lives in Lakehurst, N. J., and his mother, in the family group are a sister, Miss Mary R. Tobin and four brothers, Frank E. Tobin a veteran of the late war, Henry L. Tobin, John L. Tobin and George W. Tobin, all of Arlington.

lnt or any of his friends is held to be disturbing to the public peace if not actually sacrilegious.

OPPOSITION IS DUMB.

The deputies of the chief, that is to say, the local censors scattered through Italy wherever there is a newspaper or the chance of a newspaper appearing, are told that while excess of zeal may be condoned, no laxness will be forgiven. The papers are permitted to discuss in a purely academic way whatever measures are proposed by Mussolini, and they may criticize with the utmost tenderness the lawless arrogance of the barons; Mussolini rid Italy of Bolshevism. Rienzo's conception of the well-ordered state—lostatu bono—is much like Mussolini's theories of Fascism. Rienzo came nearer realizing all his ideals and then perished miserably. There is, of course, the difference between the fourteenth and the twentieth century, but human nature and national traits do not change. Rome has been a stage to the centuries, and this play of Mussolini is still in its second act.

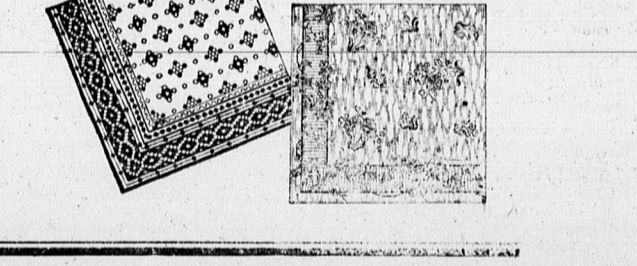

ardous one. Editorial comment, that the cleverness of his editor made his writings all the more dangerous, that is to say, displeasing to the Government. The result is that anti-Fascist papers have and comic illustration are not the only contents of the newspapers to be censored. Instances are known where papers have been closed down for publishing news of the stock exchange which was not agreeable to the censor. The ability of the writer, the justness of his criticism are no excuses. In one case, the censor pointed out to a ruined newspaper owner the truth ceased to publish political comment. One of them announced that it had either to adopt this course or be forced out of business altogether.

MUSSOLINI AND RIENZO.

A Rome correspondent of the New York Herald-Tribune, whose name is naturally suppressed observes:—

"Mussolini is a rare phenomenon in the history of Rome, but not entirely unique. At the foot of the steps that lead down the Campidoglio, past the cage where Rome keeps her she-wolf, there stands a strange statue almost solitary in the shade of an upstanding palm. The statue represents a small man dressed in mediaeval garb, with a hood that may belong to either monk or pilgrim. No inscription marks the statue other than the name "Rienzo." There is no word of blame or praise. Rienzo, too, was haunted by dreams of empire, even as Dante was. The visions and aspirations of Mussolini and make a tempting theme for comparisons. Each of them came to his country's rescue in an hour of the gravest peril. Rienzo crushed the lawless arrogance of the barons; Mussolini rid Italy of Bolshevism. Rienzo's conception of the well-ordered state—lostatu bono—is much like Mussolini's theories of Fascism. Rienzo came nearer realizing all his ideals and then perished miserably. There is, of course, the difference between the fourteenth and the twentieth century, but human nature and national traits do not change. Rome has been a stage to the centuries, and this play of Mussolini is still in its second act."
