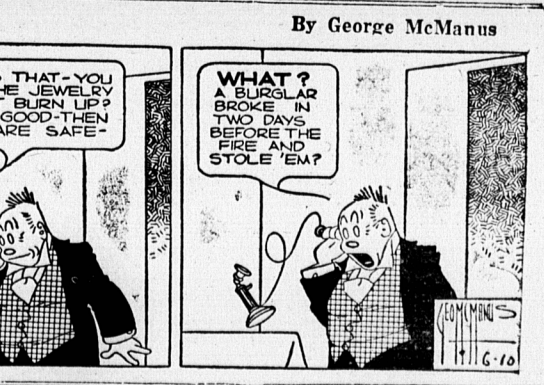

By Frederick Gardner Associated Press Financial Writer NEW YORK, June 9 (AP)—In dealings that barely kept the ticker tape alive, the stock market finished a war-resistant week Saturday, pointing slightly downward.

The Associated Press average of 60 issues was off 1 of a point at 38.2 and on the week was down 3.

U. S. Steel, Bethlehem and Youngstown ended under water. Other losers were Goodyear, Goodrich, Montgomery Ward, Boeing, Sears, Westinghouse, Allied Chemical, Texas Corp. and International Paper preferred.

Up a shade were Sperry, Consolidated Edison, Anaconda, Standard Oil of N. J., National Biscuit and General Electric.

Only Dome Mines and International Nickel, among Canadian issues, traded on the big board, the latter gaining 3-8 while Dome dropped 1-4.

Bell Telephone sold down five at 98. Imperial Oil and Lake Shore were off fractions and Shawinigan up 1-4.

Industrials weakened 41 and the goods closed 3 down in the index while the base metal and western oil groups were practically unchanged. Volume was 81,000 shares.

Daily War Survey

(By The Canadian Press) The weekend bombing of Berlin is indicative of the growing bitterness of the war and the vigor of the French air force.

It was a retaliation for the German bombing of Paris and the Germans have notice now that if they continue such raids they can expect the same thing in return.

Whether the retaliation will mean an intensification or a lessening of this kind of warfare is apparently up to the Germans.

The raid also indicates that despite their attempts to bomb air fields, hangars and bases in France the Germans are far from putting the French Air Force out of business. France entered the war weaker in air power than either Great Britain or Germany but rapid strides have since been made in building and buying planes.

One of the first objectives of a German blitzkrieg is to put the opposing air force out of action. It was done in Poland in short order. It was attempted in France and is still being attempted. In the west, however, the Germans have been matched by superior aircraft and fliers in both the French and British air forces.

A long bombing expedition, such as the French flight to Berlin re-attempts to ground it.
