BERLIN, January 26.—According to the latest returns of the Reichstag election held yesterday, received by the Wolff bureau, the socialists have gained one and lost twenty seats, the two conservative parties having gained nine and lost six seats; the clericals have gained two and lost four; the national liberals have gained nine and lost an equal number; the radical groups have gained five and lost three, and the agrarian and anti-socialist groups have gained two and lost five each.
