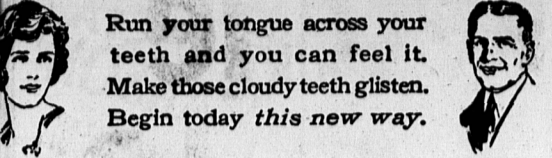

Says Dune Dwellers of Mongolia Earliest Type

PEKING, Aug. 22.—Stone implements and weapons of a race of men who lived thousands of years ago, among sand dunes on the shore of a lake since swallowed up by Gobi desert, and who discovered the eggs of the dinosaur countless ages before these were introduced to the civilized world by Roy Chapman Andrews two years ago, have been found far in the interior of Mongolia by the Third Asiatic Expedition of the American Museum of Natural History, Mr. Andrews, leader of the expedition disclosed in Peking yesterday.

N. B. Man Killed. MONCTON, N. B., Aug. 23.—Ernest Geldart, 26, son of J. M. Geldart, Prosser Brock, Albert County, was instantly killed while railway gravel train at Hopewell working on a Canadian National Hill this afternoon. Geldart and others were riding on a carload of gravel when the bottom of the car dropped down, letting out the gravel and carrying Geldart with it. The train passed over Geldart.

British Seamen Going On Strike

(Canadian Press.) LONDON, Aug. 23.—The official strike broken out in London and elsewhere threatens to spread and effect British ships in foreign ports, as it has already done in Australia according to newspaper reports. Agitation is in progress in Canadian ports. The trouble has arisen through the men having repudiated the recent agreement between the two seamen's unions and their employers for a reduction in wages by one pound sterling monthly. The strike committee says fifteen thousand men are involved and thirty-five ships are already held up in London. The Daily Mail says the strike is due to a plot by Communists who aim to bring to a standstill British shipping abroad.
