R., Park St. Charlottetown, is seriously ill of blood-poisoning in his right hand the result of a slight scratch received while cutting ice about three weeks ago. An operation was performed under the skilful treatment of Drs. Harry Johnson and Stephen Jenkins, but at latest accounts Mr. Ferguson's condition was not much improved, though doing as well as can be expected, and his early recovery is hoped for.

On Wednesday evening last after the prayer meeting in St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Montague, Miss Lily Aitken and Mrs. Alex. McDonald on behalf of the ladies of that congregation, presented Mrs. Sinclair, the wife of the pastor, with an address highly appreciative of her efforts in forwarding the work of the church. The School Trustees who were present did not stint either praise or criticism, the first judicious the second discriminating so that blame was enjoyed. Odd as that last phrase sounds it obtains that the student's sense of fair play was given scope and these little folk are better logicians than we give them credit for. The Rev. Mr. Lodge, Dr. Anderson, Dr. Taylor, Messrs. Nash and James did not merely eulogise, they stimulated the bright intelligences before them, deplored the lack of a suitable hall where these exercises might be given under favorable conditions to an audience they merited. Dr. Taylor generously offered a valuable prize for the next occasion. The judge's task will be no easy one. Bright choruses added interest to the literary program, the authors under discussion were Adelaide Proctor and Shakespeare. The musical selection from the first was Sullivan's "Lost Chord"; from Shakespeare, Dr. Arac's setting of "Blow, blow thou winter wind, thou art not so unkind as man's ingratitude. The delightful moral, and inspiring thoughts from the songs, recitations and essays and criticisms will remain in the memories of performers and listeners. The essayists were Misses Gladys Peake and Eubel Longworth on Miss Proctor, Miss Jean McLeod on Shakespeare. Principal Seaman and his staff were warmly commended and Professor Watts thanked for the suitable and well rendered music.

WHEN the improved S. S. City of London makes her debut on the routes on which she plied last season her numerous patrons will hardly recognise her at first glance. A complete transformation has occurred in the upper cabin; the only rooms left intact are the office and Captain's room combined, pilot's room, one room for passengers and two toilet rooms for ladies and gentlemen respectively. In addition to above a deck closet has been erected at the forward gangway which will hold one person only, it being the express desire of the management to do away with the habit of young men crowding such places and entertaining each other with liquor purchased in Charlottetown. There is even a greater change on the upper deck. The room aloft the pilot house has been taken of the burric deck twenty feet of the forward upper cabin dispensed with and the pilot house lowered to the promenade deck. This gives the steamer a very trim outward appearance. The cabins have been nicely painted, re-carpeted and the seating capacity, rearranged. A large English bevel plated mirror adorns the centre of the upper cabin and it is the intention to have a piano on board during the summer months. The cabins are thoroughly heated by steam. The iron hull is painted black, the bulwarks cream and the upper cabin white. The boiler and machinery have received a thorough overhauling. Good results are expected from above alterations as the deck space for excursionists has been increased 100%; the upper works will not catch so much wind and the steamer has been deprived of that lofty appearance. The same officers are in charge as last season.

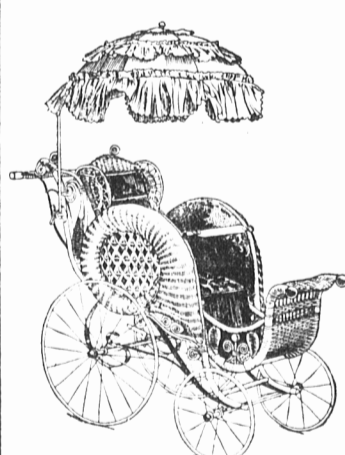
