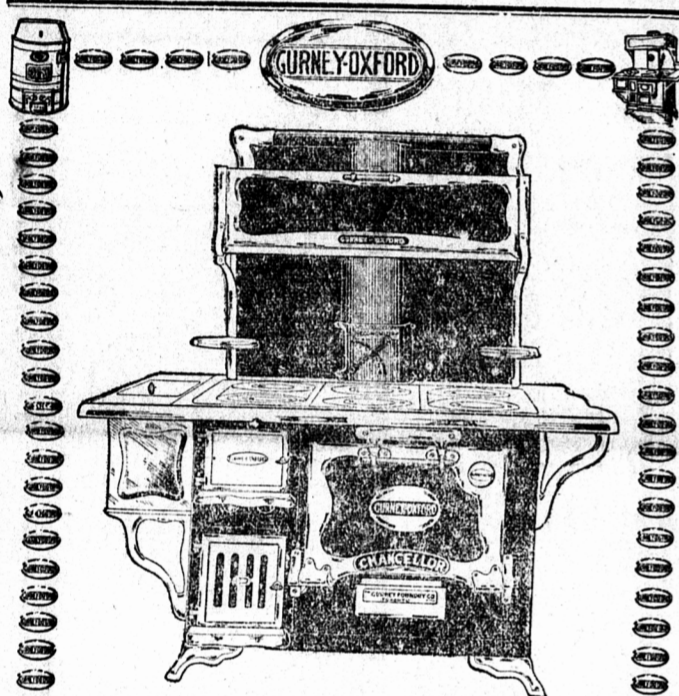

From 1 a. m. to 12 the figures 1 to 12 will appear on the dial. As noon strikes they will disappear and by an automatic arrangement the figures 13 to 24 will take their places.

### 38,000 PERSONS OWN THE WHOLE OF LONDON.

LONDON, Aug. 25.—Figures submitted yesterday to the County Council, show that London is owned by 32,000 persons. Its area is 114 square miles and its population (in 1911) 4,522,000.

Among the largest holders of real estate are the following:

Lord Northbrook and Dulwich College, over 1,280 acres each.

Lord St. Germans, H. W. Forster, H. T. B. Barron and Sir Spencer Marjony-Wilson, over 960 acres each.

Duke of Westminster, over 480 acres.

Lord Dartmouth, Prudential Assurance Company, Mercers' company and Magdalen College, Oxford, over 320 acres each.

### AUSTRALIANS TO ATTEND IMPERIAL DEFENCE CONFERENCE.

SYDNEY, N. S. W., Aug. 25.—It is officially stated that Australia will be represented at the imperial defence conference which is to be held in Canada at the end of the year. A delegation will be chosen later, and will include either Premier Cook or Hon. Mr. Mullen, minister of defence, probably the latter. The date and place of the conference are now subjects of negotiation. The minister of defence, referring to a suggestion that dependencies should supply the nucleus of an eastern force for the defence of the empire, suggests that the matter should be referred to the forthcoming conference, adding that "any thing that will tend to establish in the Pacific that naval power which we thought was secured by the 1909 agreement must be agreeable to Australians.
